

no, those were the words of a nurse after she helped deliver a baby boy in the small town hospital of McCloud, CA. That nurse was my Aunt Sybil and she was describing her thoughts about me, Deacon Chuck, to my grandmother on this day, seventy plus years ago.

So I get to share today, the day we all rejoice in the revelation that Christ was born for all mankind. I don't equate the news of my birth with that of the Christ Child. But it is enjoyable when we can make connections with other events. We remember where we were and what we were doing on 9/11. Those of us that are older remember where we were and what we were doing on the day that the news of JFK's assassination was announced.

The visit of the Magi was a milestone that helped to announce the arrival of a small child who was to be King. Let's use today as a milestone in our own life to turn away Satan and all his empty promises. 

EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

The song "We Three Kings" details the gifts of the Magi, but do you know what you're singing?

"Born a king on Bethlehem's plan, gold I bring to crown Him again." This one is the most straightforward gold symbolizes the Kingship of Christ. "Myrrh is mine: its bitter perfume breathes a life of gathering gloom." Myrrh is an embalming spice. Already at Christ's birth, we have the symbolic reminder of his death. "Frankincense to offer have I. Incense owns a deity many religious traditions, incense symbolizes prayers rising to heaven. In some pagan traditions, it is thought to help "call down" the deity. The gift of frankincense symbolizes Jesus' role as the Great High Priest, sanctifying the world through his sacrifice.


Dominican Sisters of Hawthorne (NY)
