

FROM THE DESK OF DCN. RIGO...

Isaiah informs us that the Lord says: "...my word shall not return to me void, but shall do my will,

achieving the end for which I sent it."

Jesus tells us: "...blessed are your eyes, because they see, and your ears, because they hear...the seed sown on rich soil is the one who hears the word and understand it, who indeed bears fruit and yields a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold."

Jesus is the only Word of God, sent to announce the reconciliation of the people of God to the Father thru the salvific and redemptive action of the Word made flesh. Those that hear the Word and understand it will bear good fruit and each will yield according to their own capacity, some thirty, some sixty, some one hundred.

My question to you is simple: Do you listen to the Word made flesh in your daily reflection? And listening to His Word, do you account for it in your decision- making? The Gospel clearly says that those that listen to Him will yield good fruit. What is your own yield capacity? Do you know yourself that well?

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Using the best seeds doesn't always guarantee the best plants. An older Italian gentleman straight from Italy gave me these amazing tomato seeds that he claimed produced the best tomatoes ever grown. Without doubt, the fruit he shared with me was a testament to that fact, These tomatoes were amazing! I couldn't wait until the next growing season to plant these seeds and harvest my own tomatoes. The whole experiment ended up a failure. I did everything the gentleman said, but my fruit didn't even come close. What happened? At first I was perplexed, then some years later the light dawned. The problem wasn't the seeds, it was the soil!

You cannot sow seeds in any old place and in a haphazard way and expect them to be at their best. It doesn't work that way. Planting the seeds is the easiest part. Preparing the soil is the challenge. Tilling, mulching, enriching, and building up the nutrients are all required for good fruit. Then after the seeds are planted, more care is required in order to maintain that healthy, nutrient rich environment for those seeds to sprout, grow, and flourish. God happily sows the seeds of his Word. What do we do with them?

If we expect to be a passive bystander and have good fruit magically grow, we are mistaken. Bearing the good fruit of God's Word requires preparation and work. We have to cultivate the soil of our lives so that those seeds can find a proper home. This one thing alone takes a great deal of patience, time, and effort. What kind of preparation have we put into our lives so that we can be a recipient of God's seed? It takes a great deal of soul-searching and ego-checking to properly prepare. God is the ever faithful and persistent sower. If the seeds do not bear fruit the first time, God will come back time and time again, giving it another try.

If we have created a suitable bed for sowing, then once the seed is sown, we must properly maintain them. What is our maintenance plan for the seeds of God's Word? We need not only a source for water but a watering schedule. We need to weed, aerate the soil, nurture the young plants, protect them, and provide proper nutrients. What does our spiritual maintenance plan look like? If we have done all things well, imagine what the seeds of God's Word could produce in us!

Mass Guidelines for Parishioners

Weekdays - 7:00 am Saturdays (Vigil) - 5:00 pm Sundays - 7:30 & 10:00 am, 12:30 & 5:00 pm All Masses are livestreamed on our Facebook page.

<u>Dispensation</u>: Bishop Barber's dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass will remain in place until further notice.

You must be <u>pre-registered</u> to attend a Saturday Vigil or Sunday Mass. To register, visit our website - https://holyspiritfremont.org/announcements/- or call 510.456.4969.

We will adhere to all COVID-19 guidelines:

- **1.** Face coverings or masks are required for those age 3 years and over.
- **2.** Six (6) feet of distance must be maintained between every individual. A family counts as 1 individual.
- **3.** The church will be sanitized after every Mass to prepare for the next Mass.
- **4.** Sanitize your hands upon entry into the church.
- **5.** In order to maintain social distancing, do not congregate before or after Mass.
- **6.** You must take the seat given to you by the usher. You cannot pick your seat or save seats.
- **7.** Refrain from using the church bathrooms.
- **8.** Only one person is allowed in the restroom at any time, unless a parent is accompanying a child or if you are assisting someone.
- **9.** Dismissal from the church will be by Section and Row at the end of Mass, you cannot leave until dismissed by an usher.

Self-Assessment before coming to Mass:

- **1.** Have you or a household member been in close contact with a confirmed COVID-19 case in the past 14 days (2 weeks)?
- 2. In the last 48 hours, have you had any of the

following NEW symptoms? Fever (100 F or 37.8 C) and Chills | Cough | Trouble breathing or Shortness of Breath | Wheezing | Muscle Aches | Sore Throat | Loss of Smell or Taste | Nausea, Vomiting, or Diarrhea | Headache 3. If you answered "YES" to any of the above questions and are experiencing any of the listed symptoms, you are strongly encouraged to seek

To Attend Mass:

1. To attend a Saturday Vigil or a Sunday Mass, you must be **pre-registered**.

medical help. Please do not come for Mass.

- **2.** Pre-registered attendees will receive an email confirmation that you will need to provide.
- **3.** No registration required to attend weekday Masses.
- **4.** Please arrive at least 15-30 minutes before Mass to allow enough time to be screened and seated. Please note: If you do not arrive 10 minutes before Mass begins, your reservation may be given away.
- **5.** The doors will be closed once Mass begins.
- **6.** Please drive in through the Fremont Boulevard/Central Avenue gate.
- **7.** Parishioners who have physical disabilities may park and enter from the Parish Avenue (Rectory) parking area.
- **8.** Upon your arrival, you will be directed to the Welcome Station in St. Francis Plaza for a wellness check and registration verification.
- **9.** Mass attendees will enter the church through the St. John doors.
- **10.** You must take the seat given to you by the usher. You cannot pick your seat or save seats.

The Mass Experience:

- **1.** Hymns will only be sung by the cantor. No public singing.
- **2.** The collection basket will not be passed person to person. We will have a basket or collection box at the door.

- **3.** No shaking of hands during the Sign of Peace or holding hands at the Lord's Prayer.
- **4.** Holy Communion will be distributed at the conclusion of Mass.
- **5.** The Eucharist should be received on the hand.
- **6.** Masks are to be kept on until you receive the Body of Christ, then step aside and consume the Eucharist prior to leaving the church.
- **7.** Immediately after consuming the Eucharist, you will be directed to the exit doors.

Communion Outside of Mass

Participate in the celebration of the liturgy by viewing the livestreamed Mass on our Facebook page.

Distribution of the Eucharist will take place at the following times: Saturday 6:00-6:30 pm; Sunday 1:30-2:00 pm and 6:00-6:30pm. (Please note the time change.)

A. Holy Communion in the Church:

- **1.** Enter the church through the door on the right side of the St. John the Baptist stained-glass window.
- **2.** While in line for Communion, stand six (6) feet apart and maintain social distance.
- **3.** Masks are to be kept on until you receive the Body of Christ, then step aside and consume the Eucharist prior to leaving the church.
- 4. Immediately after consuming

the Eucharist, you will be directed to the exit doors.

B. Holy Communion in the Parking Lot:

- **1.** Come to Holy Spirit Parish during times mentioned.
- 2. Please adhere to COVID-19 guidelines and wear a mask. Please note: If you have a compromised immune system or are unwell, please be safe and stay home.
- **3.** When one of our clergy approaches your car, exit your vehicle, keep face covering on, stand an appropriate distance, and receive the Body of Christ on the hand.
- 4. After receiving Communion, please say a silent prayer in your car before leaving the premises.5. Please observe reverence and proper decorum at all times.




