

FROM THE DESK OF FR. JOHN...

Friends, in this Sunday's gospel, the Lord gives us two stories about two people who find the things they wanted more than anything else in the world – a

box of treasure and a pearl of great price.

The person in the first parable was a laborer working for someone else's field. He was probably busy doing his day job. But this man was in for a huge surprise. He stumbled upon a treasure by accident. He was not really looking for it and it was the last thing he expected to find. In the second parable, the merchant was patiently and actively searching for fine pearls; eventually, his efforts paid off. In his persistent searching, he came across a pearl of great value which stood out from all the rest he had seen and owned.

Friends, Jesus tells us that these stories are about the kingdom of God.

The kingdom of God is like a buried treasure that sometimes comes to us as a huge surprise. We discover God and His kingdom when we least expect it. He comes to us unexpectedly when we are busy with our day-to-day life. He comes to us when we are preoccupied with many worries and concerns. He comes to us when our life has become fairly comfortable. Suddenly, we encounter God and His great love. Suddenly, we realize that there

is more to life than our preoccupations, worries, or comforts. God comes to us as a gift, as a grace when we least expect it.

At times, the kingdom of God is like a pearl of great price that we must search for and pursue. We must patiently look for it and passionately seek it. Sometimes, our search can take a long time, and it can be difficult and painful. But like the merchant, after a long period of time, after many battles fought with our inner demons, we finally find the one great pearl like no other. We finally find God and encounter His love.


Friends, when this happens to us, when we find God or when we are found by Him, we are called to "go and sell everything" to get this prized possession. We are called to surrender everything we have – all our preoccupations, all our concerns, all our attachments. We must surrender everything we are – all our life – to God. God must be the center of our life. Our material attachments, concerns, and passions pale in comparison to God and His kingdom.

And so, for our reflection this week, let us ask ourselves: Have I found the buried treasure or the pearl of great price in my life? Am I investing my time, efforts, and prayers in searching God and His kingdom? Am I helping my spouse, my children, and others in their search for God?

Let us pray for discernment in our hearts. Like Solomon in this Sunday's First Reading, may we ask God for wisdom that we see what truly matters in this life and the life to come.



GOSPEL MEDITATION

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

A single mother who has a child with special needs works two jobs and sacrifices much of her own pleasures in order to be available for her son. Being the best mother possible is important to her and brings her joy. We are willing to make great and often heroic sacrifices for those people and things that matter most to us. Unless there is something of obvious importance to us in our immediate path, we can easily approach life in a more haphazard and chaotic way. We jump from one thing to another, responding to whatever it is that is competing for our attention at that moment. When everything is important, nothing is important.

If we do not wear the right pair of glasses, we can get all too easily caught up in the superficial stuff and neglect paying attention to the things that really matter. The kingdom of God is like the pearl of great price that is worth selling everything for so that it can be obtained. Based on where I invest my time and energy each day, I really wonder whether I am serving God's kingdom or my own. Have you ever considered tracking how you spend your time? You may be surprised! We allow our agendas to set the clock of our lives. We forget that joy and a true sense of purpose are not going to be found in following that timepiece. Joy is the expression of the happiness that is discovered when living in the kingdom of God. When our agenda matches God, not only do we leap for joy but God leaps with delight as well. Our well-being is what matters most to God.

Can you imagine God delighting in you? It is easy to deaden our senses to the whole reality of God and the joy that living the Gospel can bring. The demands of secular life and the agendas competing for our attention can quickly do that. We can get tired and spiritually apathetic. But if we can see our way through all of the conflicting voices and hear the voice of God, we can rediscover our zeal and passion and redirect our efforts. When we begin to see as God sees, we can rise each day and notice what really needs our attention and embrace it with exuberance. Be careful, though. It may not be what we originally had on our list. Responding to it, however, will be worth putting everything else aside.




