

FROM THE DESK OF FR. JOHN...

My dear friends, the recent sacerdotal ordination of Fr. Peter Lawongkerd reminded me of my own preparations leading to my priestly

ordination a few years ago. I remember how busy I was with my guest lists, with getting the right vestments and other priestly "stuff." I was excited. And yet I knew that behind this excitement, I was experiencing a sense of anxiety. I couldn't sleep well at night because I was worried and afraid about the overwhelming sense of responsibility and my own worthiness to take upon the mission of Christ. It was scary.

Then it occurred to me that I was focusing on the wrong thing. Instead of "How should I prepare for my ordination," I should have been asking, "How does God prepare me for the priesthood?" You see, the first question will only make sense in light of the second.

I think this is true for each one of us. Most often, we tend to focus more on the first question – on our own preparations. We tend to overemphasize the things we can do, make, or accomplish to achieve holiness or the kingdom of God. We tend to lose sight on the fact that we do not earn true holiness or the kingdom of God on the sole basis of our human efforts. To be sure, our human efforts are essential, but only in light of God, only as a response to God's invitation.

We see this clearly in this Sunday's Gospel as Jesus tells a parable about the landowner and his tenants. In the parable, we see how the landowner prepared his vineyard. He cultivated his land, made it fertile, dug a wine press and built a tower. He prepared everything

necessary to produce abundant harvest. When it was ready, he gave his vineyard to the care of the tenants. But the tenants became abusive. Yet, despite their greed and selfishness, the landowner never failed to forgive them and their debts. In his infinite patience and mercy, he even sent his only son to remind them of what they owe him.

My dear friends, to the first century Jew, this parable is scandalous because no landowner in his right mind would do such a thing.

So, what is Jesus trying to tell us here? This parable is not so much about the wickedness and greed of the tenants. It is, first and foremost, about God's immense generosity, His over-the-top mercy, His superabundant love for us.

You see, God lavishes His gifts and grace upon us, continually, without ceasing. God has loved us first and never fails to love us. God makes every effort to be close to us. And just as He prepared the vineyard to be fertile, He, too, has prepared our hearts for His Son. He made us this way, capable of receiving him and his love. In other words, God has bound Himself to us so that we will be bound to Him in return.

And so, for our reflection: How am I responding to the immense love and mercy of God? How am I responding to His self-offering? Am I like the tenants who condemn themselves by rejecting the landowner and his son and by pretending that I can earn my way to my salvation and to God's Kingdom?

Lord, open my eyes and my heart that I may truly see the superabundance of Your love and mercy for me. Grant me a grateful heart. Grant me a generous heart. Grant me a heart like Yours. **Amen.**

Live the Life RESPECT LIFE MONTH

Live the Gospel of Life Respect Life Reflection

Twenty-five years ago, Pope St. John Paul II wrote that the Gospel of life is at the heart of Jesus' saving message to the world (Evangelium vitae 1). In taking on human flesh, dwelling among us, and sacrificing his very life for our redemption, Christ reveals the profound dignity of every human person. This God-given dignity does not change with our stage of life, abilities, level of independence, or any other varying circumstance.

Rather, it is rooted in the permanent fact that each of us is made in the image and likeness of God, created to share in the very life of God himself. The human person is a "manifestation of God in the world, a sign of his presence, a trace of his glory" (EV 34). And we must reflect this truth in how we act and how we treat one another.

The truth of the Gospel of life is at the foundation of who we are as followers of Christ. In his earthly life, Jesus provided the perfect model for how we are to love our neighbor and live out the Gospel call: "Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me" (Mt. 25:40).

"to imitate Christ and follow in his footsteps" The Gospel of Life 51

Jesus calls each of us to "care for the other as a person for whom God has made us responsible" (EV 87). The Gospel of life is

intrinsic to the whole Christian life and foundational to the decisions we make on a daily basis. For, "the Gospel of God's love for man, the Gospel of the dignity of the person and the Gospel of life are a single and indivisible Gospel" (EV 2, emphasis added).

In his encyclical on the Gospel of life, Pope St. John Paul II recognizes the full range of threats against human life, from poverty and malnutrition to murder and war. He places particular emphasis, however, on threats to life at its beginning and end—precisely when it is most in need of protection. In modern times, children in their mothers' wombs and those approaching the end of their lives are certainly among the "least of these" in our world's estimation. Practices such as abortion and assisted suicide tragically reject the truth that human life is always to be cherished and defended with loving concern.

As the Church celebrates the 25th anniversary of Pope St. John Paul II's prophetic encyclical, let us reflect on here we personally live out the Gospel: Do I talk about and act towards others as I would talk about and treat Items himself? Do I injure myself of the Church's teachings and engage in the civic crone or first a follower of Christ? Do I support and advocate for laws and policies that protect and defind human high? Do I help pregnant and parenting mothers in used? Am I ready to support a loved one reading death?

Through the intercession of Cur Lady of Guadalupe, may Cur Lord grant us the grace to truly and conregeously live his Gospel of life.


