

## FROM THE DESK OF DCN. CHUCK...

How would you feel if you threw a party and no one came? That is exactly what happened to the King in today's Gospel. He had a great banquet ready for the wedding

feast for his son. But the invited guests, even though summoned twice, either ignored the invitation or went about other business. Others even mistreated or killed the messengers who delivered the invitation.

The implications are pretty clear that this parable is about God opening up His kingdom with an invitation for all to join Him in His heavenly banquet. And the messengers who have delivered that invitation have, in some cases, been ignored and even killed. All the Apostles, except one, were martyred, in addition to many who carried the message after them through the ages.

We may think that doesn't happen anymore, but even in today's world messengers are martyred. There have also been numerous

occurrences of mistreatment and harassment throughout the world and even in our own country and area. Witness the current restrictions on church services, especially those in place in San Francisco. Yes, there are safety considerations but these limitations for the church world are far more restrictive than those for the secular world. And consider our elected officials who are questioning whether a person's religious beliefs should preclude them from holding offices in government.

What about you personally? I know we are in a period of unusual circumstances, but prior to this, have you turned down or ignored the invitation to the feast that is offered every Sunday at Mass. Did you choose to go elsewhere? Did you choose to go to your son's baseball game or your daughter's soccer game?

The next time you have a party and people choose to either ignore the invitation or go elsewhere, stop and review your own life. Have you ever ignored God's invitation or mistreated or harassed His messengers? If so, there is still time to join the party. God is waiting just for you. All you need to do is ask Him to allow you to take part in His heavenly banquet.


# St. John Bosco Prison Ministry Fundraiser 2020

# Live the Life RESPECT LIFE MONTH

The Gospel of Life: A Brief Summary

The propheric papel encyclical Evangehain vitae (The Goepel et Life) was written by Pope St. John Paul II in 1995 et veriffirm the ratio and inviolability of every homen life and to appeal to all people to vespect, protest, love, and every human life. The following is a brief overview of this important document.

The Gospel of Life is at the Pozer of Jesus' saving message to the world. Through the Incamation and birth of Christ. God reveals to us the dignity of all human life. Human life, as a gift of God, is sacred and inviolable. The Son of God has united metallic with every human being and desires for us to share stemal life with him. For this reason, direct attacks on human life, such as abortion and outlems is, see always unscriptable. Yet, early we see now and expending threats to housen life anerging on an alaminy scale. These new threats in life are often justified, posteet at and even promoted by our loves and culture.

Not only must human life not be taken, but it must be protected with loving concern. Each of its is made in the image and likeness of God, and we reflect his glory in the world. God made the human person with the capacity to love and reason and stare in a relationship with the Coales. The human person bears an indubble import of God such as the principle of all extensity. The source of our dignity is not only linked to our acceptance by God, but to our final end and destiny to spend eternity with the Eather, By accepting Christian mr. Despite the grave threats to human life in the modern world, we, as the People of God, are called to place our faith in Jesus, the "World of life" (J. In 1:1). As Christians, we have received the tall fruth about human life as proclaimed by the very person of Jesus. In sharing in the low-licet and most voluctable conditions of human life as proclaimed as cross. Jesus shows us that life solvers good. The broad-messing effect levels is found in groung and recovering leve. It is only through this understanding of a singeric gift of soft that human scanship and proceeding and foll significance.

God holds the lives of all people in his gentle and loving care, giving meaning and value to any sufferings that we may hear. Despite the mystery which surrounds suffering and death, they can become saving events as we unite them with Christ's sacrifice. Truly great must be the value of human life if the Son of God has made if the instrument of our salvation.

Scientific and technological advances and an increasingly secularized world have led to an eclipse of the value of human life. However, respect for life requires that science and technology should always be at the service of the human person and his integral development. We must reject systems of structuralized sin which value efficiency and productivity over human persons.

Governments and international institutions promote abertion and outbanasis as marks of progress and freedom. But this is a false and pervises multi-standing involved individual translation of the freedom. But this is a false and pervises multi-standing involved individual, recognizing that God has corrusted us to one another. As cultures and societies fall to recognize these objective truths, everything becomes relative and all principles are called into question—even the fundamental right to tife. However, the blood of Christia specifice remains our constant hope. Christia gift of himself on the cross reveals how precious life truly is and gives us the strength to commit ourselves to building a pattern of life. Christia blood, shed for us, promises that in God's plan death will be no mean and life will be victorious.

Society as a whole must respect, defend and primote the dignity of every limitan person, at every moment and in every condition of that person's bits. Our lives are a gift from Got, and ultimately belong to him. He has sole authority over life and death. We are therefore called to reverence and love every human person, leving our neighbors as conselves. It is not responsibility to care for and protect human life, especially the lives of the most valuerable among us.

Having received the grift of the Gospet of Life, we are the people of life and a people for life. It is one duty to proclaim the Gospel of Life to the world. For proclaim steens is to proclaim the fundion person impel us to bring the Gospel of life to the licents of all people and make it penetrate every part of society. In every child which is born and in every person who lives or dies we see the image of God's glory. We celebrate this glory in every human being, a sign of the living God, an icon of Jesus Christ.
