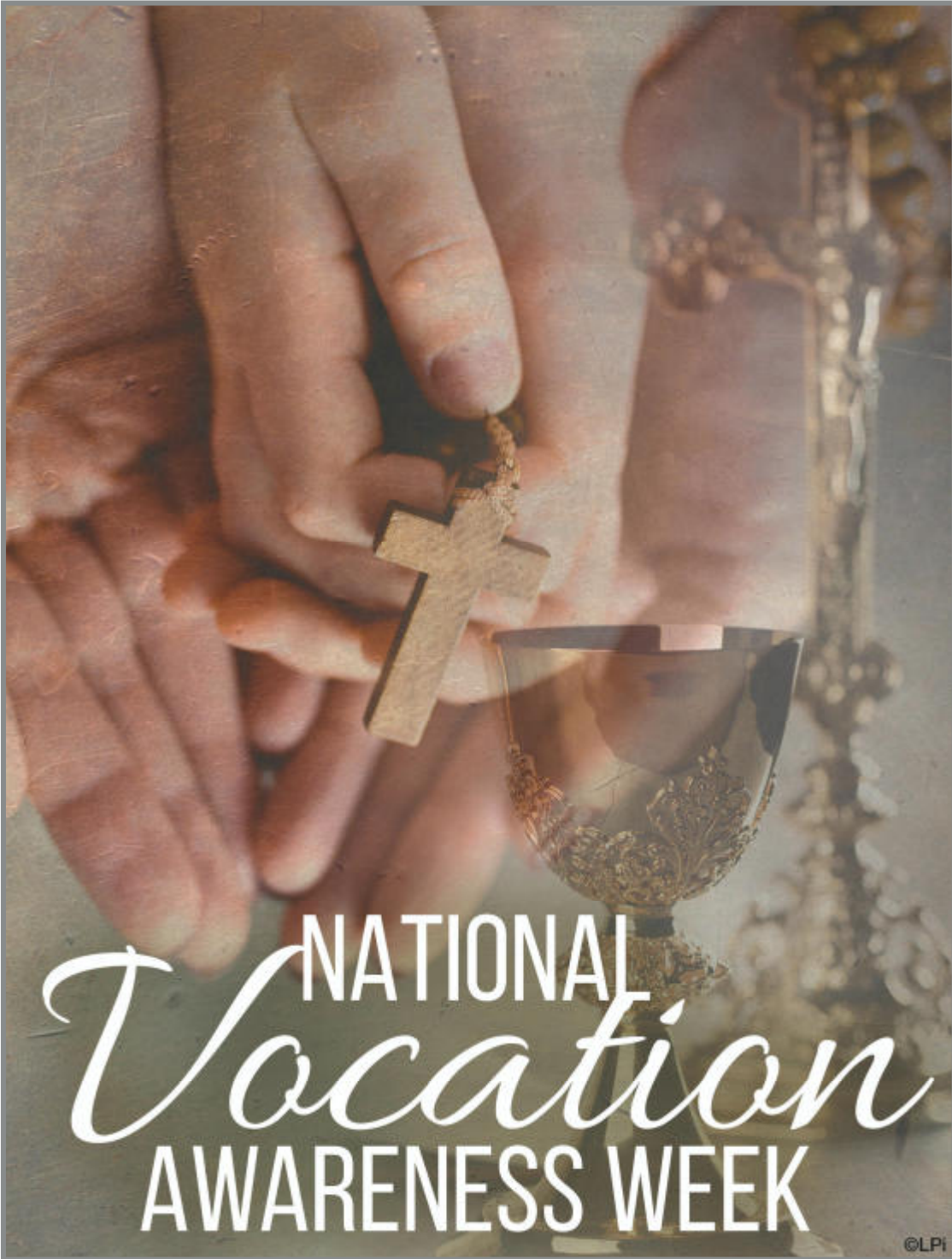

FROM THE DESK OF FR. PETER...

Dear Friends,

This Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints and tomorrow, Monday, we dedicate our prayer for the faithfully departed – our

brothers and sisters who have run the race, have endured to the end, and now enjoy eternal peace, happiness and have truly been blessed with the fulfillment for which we yet hope.

We, too, are called to be counted among the blessed, people of hope and all saints!

Our first reading from the book of Revelation describes the vision of Heaven: The Lord God, beauty, goodness, truth, tenderness, and love in its fullness. All of this awaits us. One day we will join all the angels and saints who worshiped God and acclaimed: “Amen. Blessing and Glory, wisdom and Thanksgiving, honor, power, and might be to our God forever and ever. Amen.” To see God and to be like God: this is our hope!

When asked by their teacher, “What does it take to be a saint?”, one student responded, “You have to be dead.” The question arises: Do we really have to be dead to be a saint? St. John the Apostle, in the second reading,

elaborates, “What we shall be has not yet been revealed” but “We are God’s children NOW!” As we continue our journey here on earth, we must not forget that each day and every day of our lives are truly a blessing. We are blessed because we are created in the image and likeness of God. We are sons and daughters of God. Of course, life can have difficult moments at times, but with HOPE our hearts and minds go forward and look ahead to what really awaits us.

One wise priest once told me, “Don’t give up on life, don’t let your life fall apart. Grab your life and live it!” This is what it means to be a saint. This is what holiness is all about. Today and tomorrow are days of hope, of love, of faithfulness, and of endurance.

The Gospel today is a little bit like a stained-glass window. Jesus is giving us a portrait of a saint. He is showing us the kind of person that He calls us to be as sons and daughters of God. The different Beatitudes could be understood like the different pieces of coloured glass that make up a stained-glass window. Each individual beatitude is a way of following the Lord and Jesus is saying that the people who live out of these Beatitudes are truly blessed. They will know the Lord’s joy, beauty, goodness, truth, tenderness, and love in its fullness, both, in this life and in eternity.

Be blessed! Be hopeful! Be a saint!

Blessed are you when they insult and persecute you and utter every kind of evil against you falsely because of me. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven.

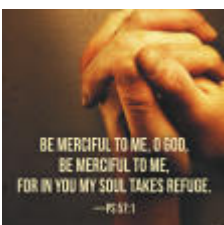
