

NOURISH





FROM THE DESK OF FR JOHN...

Friends, our Lord Jesus gives us another parable in this Sunday's gospel. The story says that a man entrusted his possessions to his

servants before going on a journey, "to one he gave five talents; to another, two; to a third, one - to each according to his ability."

The man in the parable represents Our Lord Jesus himself, and the servants all baptized Christians. "Talents" are not really the same as how we understand talents today, such us talents in music, arts, sports, public speaking, etc. It is more than that; a "talent" refers to an ancient Roman coin of incredible value. Biblical scholars would estimate that the value of one talent could amount to \$10 million dollars.

So what do "talents" represent? These are gifts of great value that our good and gracious God has entrusted to each one of us.

What are these gifts entrusted to us? Everything! Everything we have received from God — our life, health, family, friends, wealth, freedom, faith, and so on. They all come from God. Put into our hands. Entrusted to our care. What's the fitting way to use these gifts? Not by clasping onto them. Not by keeping and holding them tightly for ourselves. But by giving them away, by sharing. Exactly how Jesus did it. He gave Himself away – not just a portion of Himself but all of Himself. God took the risk first. He took the risk of entrusting Himself to us. And we see it in the most sublime and beautiful way on the Cross.

Friends, that's how God's gifts entrusted to us increase and multiply. The first two servants understood this really well. You see, our gifts only grow to the extent that we give it away. We only increase in the measure that we give ourselves away. The third servant didn't grasp this; he buried the talent instead of investing it. And he was condemned by his master not because he didn't know how to invest, but because he fundamentally misunderstood the nature and the content of what had been given. In the same way, if we cling to our gifts in the same manner as the third servant, they don't grow; in fact, they wither away.

Lord Jesus, be the ruler of my heart and mind and the master of my home and goods. Fill me with a generous and wise spirit that I may use the gifts, time and treasure you give me for your glory and your kingdom.
