FROM THE DESK OF FR. PETER...

Today, we celebrate "Gaudete Sunday" which means "Rejoice" and we light the rose candle on the Advent Wreath. The

celebrants also wear rose-colored vestments. Today's feast reminds us once again that we, the faithful followers of Christ, are called to live with joy.

A question remains: Where is true joy to be found?

In our first reading, we heard the prophet Isaiah together with the people of Israel exulting in their call as bearers of God's good tidings: "I rejoice heartily in the Lord, in my God who is the joy of my soul; for he has clothed me with a robe of salvation." The greatest joy for humanity is to know that we are loved by God and that He sent His only begotten Son to be one of us and to live among us. Through Him, with Him, and in Him, we become the adopted children of God and together share the gifts of salvation.

The responsorial Psalm has again the Song of Mary who exults in the mercy of God from generation to generation. We rediscover in Mary the joy of faith. Despite an uncertain future, Mary continually trusts in God's plan of Salvation and welcomes Jesus joyfully into her life.

St. Paul, in our second reading, calls on the Thessalonians to "rejoice always" and immediately calls on them to continue to "pray without ceasing" and always give thanks to God in every circumstance. No matter what happens to us, we can always give thanks to God in the midst of its happening. We may be struggling in various ways, but there is always something in which we can find grace and return joy and gratitude.


John the Baptist in today's gospel fully realized that he is not the Christ. Rather than becoming the person others wanted him to be, John the Baptist was content to be the person God wanted him to be: to be the voice who prepares for God's Son. He was happy to serve Christ and to share this good news with others.

My dear friends, the prophet Isaiah, Mary, Paul, and John the Baptist witnessed their joy and the presence of God in their lives. Let us look around for the signs of God's presence in our lives and in our families. Together during this Gaudete Sunday, we "return to joy" or "reaffirm our joy." Let us choose to be joyful and choose it everyday!

GOD IS THE JOY OF MY SOUL

GOSPEL MEDITATION Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Did you ever stop and realize that there is no earthly gain that can ever really satisfy us? Think of winning the Lotto. On this side of the winning ticket, it's all about the money, the new car, house, vacations, bank accounts, and infinite pleasures. The possibility of acquiring all of these earthly securities brings us back again and again to the purchase of a ticket. Then, one day we win! Our dreams are fulfilled, and happiness is on the horizon. Then one day, we wake up and realize that nothing has really changed, and I am not as satisfied as I thought I was or would be. I find myself living in my incompleteness and with my profound sorrow and grief. I did not find joy.

Glimpses of joy are possible but not by material means. They are brought to us through incredible experiences of connection that bring us face to face with real and authentic faith, hope, and love. And, they are glimpses and do not last. The moment we find ourselves looking back at them, they are gone, and we find ourselves remembering the moment in memory. To carry joy within us is to realize that it is not something I create, manufacture or even acquire. It is not able to be purchased. It is a glft. My need for joy mirrors my need for eternity, for a Creator who has a claim on the very essence of who I am and desires a home within me. As C. S. Lewis discovered, joy is a surprise that speaks to my very soul and is given as gift by the God who loves me.

The beauty of Advent is found in discovering the beauty of the gift of joy. God has visited his people for no other reason than to show them where and how to find joy! All of our human and earthly joy experiences are always only glimpses. They never satisfy us, sustain us or fulfill us. It is only God who is the joy of my soul. Real, Divine experiences of joy catch us off guard, make us stop and become aware, bring a feeling of awe and rightness and have an eternal Otherness about them. Nothing created by humans can ever come close to this. We probably will not fully realize the truth of all of this until we actually meet God face to face in heaven one day. Then, in that sacred moment when our hearts leap for joy we will understand what we have been tirelessly searching for all along. Intense gratitude will most surely follow.


