FROM THE DESK OF FR. KEN...

Welcome to the 3rd Sunday of Lent everyone!

This Sunday, our Lord speaks to us about His Father's house. He says to us, if a Christian

comes to Mass on Sundays but for the rest of the week does not care about Christ, cheats in business or in school, lies, shows no love, then the religion of this person is not genuine.

Our Lord tells us today that true religion is worship in spirit and in truth, and it unifies our lives in such a way that there is no part reserved for God and another part for ourselves only. God is to be present in all we do, and Christ is our companion in all our life.

Our First Reading today talks about the Commandments as Charter of Covenant Fidelity. God gave his "ten words" to his people not so much as laws to be obeyed, but rather as a charter of their freedom. By following this, they expressed their loyalty to the faithful God of the covenant. Our Second Reading today addresses that those looking from the outside see Jesus' death on the cross as either folly or a failure. But for those who believe, it is the source of life.

Our Gospel talks to us about working toward a New Temple. Christ purifies the Jewish Temple from being a place that confines God. The Romans will destroy it. For we can encounter the Risen Christ anywhere and he will be the foundation of the new People of God.

My dear brothers and sisters, by his words and actions, Jesus instructs that we must serve God as he himself did: in spirit and in truth. Our everyday living must correspond with what we believe, in loyal service to God and people. We must make ourselves free for him and people, in respect and love.

May God bless you and guide you: The Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. **R/ Amen.** Let us go and build together the community in which Jesus lives.
