

FROM THE DESK OF FR. PETER...

Dear Holy Spirit Family,

On this 19th Sunday in ordinary time, the story of Elijah in the first reading is

one that we all might find easy to identify with.

When we reflect on our own lives, there are times when the journey of life seems to be too much for us. With all the things that are happening around us – the pandemic, the lockdown, death of family members, sharper conflicts in our relationships, plus all the usual stress at home and at work – we are being pushed to our limit. Like Elijah, we can find ourselves feeling or saying, "I've had enough."

In the second reading, Paul is telling us not to give up too easily. We know that life can be boring at times, very repetitive. And yet, our work and commitments are so time-consuming that we are often left with the feeling of not getting anywhere.

Paul reminds us to renew our faith and trust in the Holy Spirit. He is the one who gives us life, who gives us hope and the courage to move forward. We need to see again the Spirit of God walking with us. When we do so, we will be a "fragrant aroma to God." We will rejoice once more and walk in the eyes and the presence of God.

In our gospel, Jesus went home to Nazareth. Instead of being welcomed, the townsfolk said to him, "What are you doing here?" But Jesus did not give up. He moved on and continued his mission and his good works. That's a good lesson for us; we must not pay too much attention to criticisms or complaints. We rejoice instead that we are daily fed with the Body and Blood of Christ.

Inspiration for the week

Are we willing to be taught by God? If we are, then we will begin to see things and make judgments using a Divine lens. Often, we perceive things with purely human eyes and reference points. When we do this, reality can lose its Divine spark and we miss what God is trying to say. When using human eyes exclusively, Jesus is at best perceived simply as a prophet who has some wise things to say. The human element has a difficult time seeing Jesus' divinity and recognizing him as the Bread of Life that comes down from heaven. We can easily get stuck on Jesus' human associations and overlook the marvelous wonders God wants us to see. If we really allow ourselves to be taught by God, we will then come to see the truth about Jesus and the abundant everlasting life God offers. Jesus becomes the key that unlocks all of our relationships: with God, others, ourselves, and creation. He, as the true and lasting bread from heaven, shows us the gifts of faith, hope, and love that God bestows on us. Through this divine lens we see that all life sparkles and glows with God's love.
