

FROM THE DESK OF DN. BERNARD...

Cut off your hands if it causes you to sin! Are you serious? Does Jesus really mean this?

It was a beautiful quiet morning when a 27-year-old avid adventurer and outdoorsman named Aron Ralston, fell into a narrow gap in Utah's Bluejohn Canyon and was trapped when a falling 800-pound boulder pinned his right hand to the canyon wall. He knew immediately that he was in deep trouble. Bluejohn Canyon was well within his technical and physical ability, but that freak accident had him trapped. Even worse, He broke his own first rule: He had failed to mention to anyone where he was going that day. His family and friends were used to him going away for days without contacting anyone, so they were not even looking for him.

With his arm still wedged beneath the boulder, Ralston even recorded a video message to his parents telling them goodbye, hoping that someone would advise his family if he didn't make it out alive.

Trapped for more than five days and having run out of food and water, Ralston suffered not only from the pain in his hand but from dehydration and hypothermia, as well as blood loss. However, he made a remarkable choice. Ralston decided to amputate his arm in order to save himself. It was a painful decision; using only a pocketknife (what an amazing display of courage and determination), he was able to free himself and applied tourniquet to his arm and rappelled nearly 70 feet to the canyon floor. After which he hiked for about 5 miles before he was able to encounter a family of three hikers who came to his rescue. Despite being trapped by the rock, he says "boulders" in life come at us from all directions,

be it dealing with financial struggles, grappling with a family member's medical diagnosis, or going through a divorce. "The boulders can be burdens, they absolutely feel like that," Ralston said. "And at the same time, you know they also bring life's greatest blessings."

Aron Ralston made the obviously excruciating decision to amputate his right arm to save his life. It's an amazing story, especially because a majority, if not all of us, would not make the same choice. We would rather scream and die in pain than detach ourselves. "If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off. It is better for you to enter into life maimed than with two hands to go into hell." Aron Ralston certainly made the right choice; he severed his arm in order to live. There are choices we must make in life and the choice we make determines our destiny. The gospel tells us that if we are to follow Christ, we must make the right choices, and if there are hindrances such as evil things that obstruct us from following Him, we should cut/detach ourselves from them.

Jesus tells us that we should not allow any other thing in this world to distract/prevent us from the path that leads to God's Kingdom. Reminding us that if we hold dearly in our hearts things that lead us to sin, we should let them go, and instead allow God to reign in our hearts.

If something causes you to sin, cut it off! Yes, Jesus is serious, and He really means it! He instructs this to us, because He loves us so much and wants us to be with Him in His Kingdom.

Lord, lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil, Amen.

HERE'S THE SITCH...

As a reported in last week's "Here's the Sitch," a campus master planning committee (CMPC) has been formed with the goal of planning out a roadmap for the future of the parish and parish school physical campus.

The planning committee is made up of school board members, clergy, staff, and others with a specialty-suited backgrounds (e.g., a civil engineer).

One of the first actions taken and completed was to do a full land and topographical survey of the entire campus.

The next decision made by the CMPC was to engage an architect and utilize the "Programming" process as we had done in 2015 for the church interior renovation. Programming is the process of defining all the activities that take place on the campus. This process gives the entire parish community the opportunity to provide input and be heard. All data collected will then be given to the architect who will design optimum spaces—including indoors, outdoors, parking, pedestrian walkways, etc.— to suit various parish activities and needs.
