FROM THE DESK OF DN. BERNARD...

"This poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury".

The Widow represents dependence on God. She didn't think of withholding her

last coins for her own needs because she was certain that God will take care of her. She makes her sacrifice without reservation by offering from her poverty her whole self, her being, her whole livelihood because she trusted and loved God so much. At times, we give generously to the church in the hope of getting something more. The widow summons us to authentic giving. Joy is not the reward, but in giving which then becomes a sign of our self-surrender to God.

The bible gives us instructions on how to give.

Tithes:

It started after Abram was blessed then gave God a tenth of everything. It is one way of worshiping God to honor Him as your provider and remind yourself that everything belongs to Him and are given through His grace. 10% tithing is required by Mosaic law and Judaic tradition. "Speak to the Levites and say to them: When you receive from the Israelites the tithe I give you as your inheritance, you must present a tenth of that tithe as the Lord's offering." (Num 18:26)

Firstfruits:

Firstfruits was the Jewish feast held in the early spring at the beginning of the grain harvest. No grain was to be harvested at all until the firstfruits offering was brought to the Lord. It is in remembrance of the Lord's deliverance from slavery to the promised land: "Honor the Lord with your wealth, with firstfruits of all your produce." (Prov 3:9)

Offering:

Offering is a voluntary act of giving either to the church or to charity. It may be monetary, food, clothing or in the form of your time or talent in doing God's work for humanity. "Consider this: whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each must do as already determined, without sadness or compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." (2 Cor 9:6-7)

Almsgiving:

Almsgiving is an act of worship to God and a practice of Judeo-Christian tradition of giving money or food to the poor and needy people. Mt 6: 3-4 says: "But when you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right hand does."

A priest friend would always remind us, that we should always offer to God the very best that we have. Never offer to God a secondhand item or something cheap. Likewise, when you give a bargained gift to someone you love, do you really love that person? Which brings us back to the story of Cain and Abel. Cain presented some of his produce from the land as a gift to the Lord, while Abel brought the firstborn lamb of his flock. God showed favor upon Abel's sacrifice because it was an offering that came from the best Abel had to give. The true measure of giving is: "to love by giving even if it hurts."

Jn 3:16 reminds us of the greatest gift of it all: "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life." Jesus died, for you and for me. The greatest expression of love.
