

FROM THE DESK OF FR. EDDIE...

Dear Friends in Christ.

Merry Christmas! At last, we celebrate the glorious birth of our Lord and Savior as we joyfully

proclaim, "Joy to the World, the Emmanuel, God is With Us!" There is so much joy and light which the birth of Jesus brings into our families and into the world! Amid the pandemic, the message is clear, "Be not afraid, a Savior has been born to us!" This Sunday, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family which should be the model for all families here and throughout the world.

When we gaze at the images of the Divine Infant Jesus, Mary and Joseph in the crib this Christmas, let us be grateful with the mystery of the Incarnation: "God so loved the world that He sent his only Son." During this Christmas season, we celebrate the most precious gift - God becoming one like us except sin and thus He fills our lives with love, joy and peace. Let us remember that the story of Jesus did not conclude in Bethlehem. Rather, it continued in the Holy Family of Nazareth. God has chosen to be a part of the human family. To those who have passed away, we pray that they may rest peacefully in God's dwelling place. We ask for God's blessing on our families and homes, that they may become havens where the love and joy of the Emmanuel would be felt by all. The reading from St Paul to the Colossians tells us how to make our homes like the home of Nazareth by manifesting these to one another: compassion, gentleness, patience, and forgiveness. St. Paul added, "And over all these put on love, that is, the bond of perfection."

During this time of partying as the Christmas season continues, I fervently hope that you will find some time to pray together as a family, whether in church or in your own homes. Please pray for me, my brother priests, and all our staff and team here at Holy Spirit Church. Please pray, in this joyful season, that we may be more loving and forgiving towards each other. Pray, too, for the complete end of this pandemic. Our strength, our renewal, our healing comes only from God.

I would like to send my personal gratitude to each of you and your families, to our pastor and my brother priests, and all the parish staff for being a part of our Spirit-filled and dynamic community here at Holy Spirit Church and for welcoming me as well. May the peace and joy of this Christmas season embrace you all with the wonder of the birth of Jesus, our Emmanuel! May the beautiful Feast of the Holy Family bless each and every family of Holy Spirit Catholic Church!



Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Families can be very difficult things to negotiate. This is true not only of our families of origin, the current family of which we are a part, the family of our Church, our society, and our global family as well. Everything human can be found in family stories. Those stories speak of wonderful life-giving successes as well as painful spirit-robbing abuses. Our greatest joys and our greatest wounds are usually connected with the experience of family. Our needs, experiences, and unresolved baggage often color what we bring to our familiar relationships. They contribute to our level of defensiveness, how guarded and protected we become, and what prejudices we believe.

In order to break the cycle of dysfunction we have to remember that it is not only by human effort that we negotiate the difficult and challenging events of our lives. There is a Divine Effort at work as well. For sure, the human effort can create quite a mess and easily destroy lives. This is true of any family with which we are associated. Today's Feast of the Holy Family serves to help us understand that there is a Divine Story being told as well. It is a story of perseverance in the face of hardship, determination in the face of despair, healing when we see nothing but wounds, and light where there is darkness.

Do we believe that God is always working, guiding, restoring, and leading? Unless we do, we will never be free from the imperfections and wounds that bind us and never be able to understand what it really means to forgive. Pope Francis tells us that the "light which comes from the Holy Family encourages us to offer human warmth to other families." While this is most certainly true, we can only really begin to do this when we realize that we are still works in progress, not anchored to the wounds and sins of our past, and still a leading star in God's continually unfolding story of love. The Holy Family persevered and radiated warmth because they knew they were not alone. We can too.
