

FROM THE DESK OF FR. EDDIE...

There is an invitation, a calling from God to everyone of us. God dares us to follow Him and to set aside all our worries, fears, failures, and brokenness so that we could become instruments of

sowing the seeds of the Gospel in our times. Indeed, God will come into our lives when we least expect it and will summon us to get out of our comfort zones to do something great and glorious in His name.

On this Sunday, our readings present three men who respond to God's call - Isaiah, Paul, and Peter. All of them feel incompetent, incapable, and unworthy to heed God's call. At one of the most significant points in the history of the Israelites, Yahweh summons Isaiah to be a prophet. Isaiah laments and objects due to his unworthiness to be the voice of God, yet his fears and doubts are completely removed when the seraphim cleanses his mouth and lips with burning ember from the altar. Isaiah responds, "Here I am, send me."

In this last major 'teaching' section of the First Letter to the Corinthians, Saint Paul reaffirms and defends the Christian teaching of the resurrection of the dead. Yet in the same letter, the apostle Paul humbly accepts, "For I am the least of the apostles, not fit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace to me has not been ineffective." Being an apostle is not something which Paul is boasting about; instead, he acknowledges that he has toiled harder than anyone, not by his own capacity but by the grace of Christ working in and through him.

Our Gospel today tells us the story of the call of Peter, James and John, following the miraculous catch of fish. Like Isaiah, Simon Peter cries and bemoans before Christ of his unworthiness, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." But Jesus does not accept Peter's protests and does not even condemn Peter of his sinfulness, but simply replies, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." God is not interested whether we are worthy or ready. Rather, God is much interested in how we respond. By His grace, God desires that we put out into the deep so that we could become concrete and visible signs of His presence to others.

By virtue of baptism, we share in the apostolic calling and mission. Since God calls each one of us, what will our answer be? Is it a "YES" or a "NO?" Are we ready and be more than willing to be challenged by the call of God, and find the foundations of our life shaken when God calls, as Isaiah found the foundations of the Temple shaken when God called him? Can we be like Simon Peter? Despite our own unworthiness, can we let Jesus take away our fear and take possession of us? Can we let Jesus work in us and through us like what He did to Saint Paul who regarded himself as the least among all the apostles?

"When they brought their boats to the shore, they left everything and followed him." This is an attitude that we need to nurture when God calls us. We will put out into the deep for a catch for we trust in the overflowing grace of God. We will leave everything behind for God's call is what gives us the truest sense of purpose and meaning of our earthly lives until we come to the fullness of God's glory.

Let us pray for the grace that may we become fishers of men and never forget that to get a catch, we listen to Jesus who says, "PUT OUT INTO THE DEEP..." Happy Fishing everyone

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

"Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man," these words, uttered by Simon Peter, can be found on any one of our lips. What real significance do I have in the big picture of God's Divine plan? Even though we try our best to hide it, we all suffer from a lack of faith. We get tired, confused, and often lack any sincere desire to put anything into our relationship with God. It's easier to simply reap whatever benefits the world has to offer and call it a day. Floating along on the superficial currents of life doesn't require much effort and seems to get us through the day. Confronting our own infidelity, apathy, weakness of spirit, and doubt in God's providence, how can we even remotely be considered a worthy vessel of God's presence or credible voice for His message?

This is the irony of faith. God doesn't seek the perfect vessels. He likes the broken ones. There is something to be said about living honestly and sincerely, and wrestling with sin, imperfection, and weakness rather than skipping through the peripheries of life with pretention, arrogance, and mendacity. If we believe ourselves to be our own "god" and serve only ourselves, we close the door to ever being used by the real and only True God. But, if we at least acknowledge that there is One greater than ourselves, then even in our deepest poverty and lowliness, God can enter.

Lessons are best learned from those who suffer. Only someone who has been lonely and lost can attest to the beauty of both Divine and human friendship. Only those who have really lost their way know what happens when they are found. Only those who are afraid know what it is to be calmed by God. The Gospel is messy because life is messy. There are no black and white solutions to problems and challenges that are hazy and gray. When our hesitancy to encounter God gets replaced by friendship with God, we become more aware of our dignity and the fact that we are loved just as we are. We cannot be afraid to share our struggles, reservations, fears, and sinfulness with others. Our genuineness and sincerity will speak of the God who blesses us in our weakness.

Synod 2021-2023

- Collect responses to present to Bishop Barber and send onto the Vatican.
- Bishops from throughout the world will gather together in 2023.

Bring Your Marriage into the Church: Group Convalidation

Catholic Church law requires baptized Catholics to marry before a Catholic priest or deacon. In Catholic tradition, the vows exchanged by the couple are a sacred pact between each other with Christ as their partner. Studies have shown that couples who recognize God's presence in their relationships experience greater contentment and are more likely to have a lifelong marriage. Couples who bring their marriage into the Church welcome God's grace and special blessings upon their marriage.

If your vows were exchanged in the presence of ministers from other religious traditions or civil officials, we invite you to bring new meaning to your relationship by embracing the vocation of marriage.
