FROM THE DESK OF DN. BERNARD...

The Gospel of today tells us that after a night of not catching any fish at all, Jesus said to His Apostles when it was already dawn, "Cast the net over the right

side of the boat and you will find something."

"The right side" and "it was already dawn" caught my attention!

Sometimes we make the wrong choices especially when our mind is shrouded in darkness, and in life it is understandable. But if we don't learn from our mistakes and continue to repeat them, then that is totally different altogether.

Being on the right side and doing the right thing would bring us rewards; they may not be material (earthly) but rather spiritual (heavenly) rewards.

Do what is right, not what is easy!

Following Christ is the right way, but it comes with a lot of challenges. Jesus said: "Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple."

People of great wisdom have always advised others to do what is right in the sight of God.

Abraham Lincoln, despite objections and criticisms from many, acted courageously and played a key role in freeing slaves through the Emancipation Proclamation, which officially ended slavery in America. Martin Luther King, Jr. spoke out boldly to bring greater equality to America and ensure civil rights for all people, regardless of race.

St. Maximilian Kolbe volunteered to die in place of a man in the Auschwitz concentration camp's starvation bunker.

St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta dedicated her life to serving and seeing God in the poorest of the poor.

Peter denied Christ when he professed, "I don't know the man", not once but thrice, but Jesus gave Peter a second chance. In the same way, He gives all of us the opportunity to redeem ourselves. Jesus alters Peter's triple denial to a triple declaration of love, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you", after which he instructs Peter to feed His lambs and tend to His sheep.

Our humble contrition changes our darkness into light. By doing things the right way (God's way, not our way), Peter was restored to God's friendship and became the foundation of the Catholic Church which Jesus Christ had established.

These are just a few who left a mark and shaped the world in building God's Kingdom.

Yes, every one of us can make a big difference. We can do so if we start making the right move in changing our ways, and if we choose not to stay in darkness by following the light of Jesus Christ.

God is so gracious! Thanks be to God, Alleluia!
