# FROM THE DESK OF DN. BERNARD...

The feeding of the five thousand men (actually more than five thousand were fed if we include women and children) is recorded on all four gospels accounts. Written to the Jew, Roman

and Gentile audiences.

This is probably a glimpse of the Last Supper and the fulfillment of the promise that Jesus will always be with us in the Holy Eucharist.

As we celebrate the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, we express our appreciation and joy for the gift of the Eucharist. Jesus points out to the whole world who He really was/is: "For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world." Jn 6:33

The crowd said to Him, "Sir, give us this bread always." Jn 6:34

(Sounds similar to what the Samaritan woman on the well asks: "Sir, give me this water, so that I may not be thirsty or have to keep coming here to draw water." Jn 4:15).

Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to Me will never hunger, and whoever believes in Me will never thirst." Jn 6:35

Believing in Jesus Christ as the source of our spiritual existence is how we gain eternal life. When we put our faith in Him, He gives us the spiritual nourishment that will sustain our lives.

The feeding of the five thousand story is very symbolic of the Mass. Jesus welcomed the crowds from all walks of life and who were from different places (introduction). He spoke about the Kingdom of God (Word of God), He healed those who needed to be cured (Intercessions).

Later on, Jesus took the five barley loaves and two fishes (Offertory), raised His eyes to heaven, and pronounced a blessing over them (Eucharistic Prayer); He broke them, and gave it to His disciples to distribute to the crowd (Communion). All were fed and were satisfied (His essence will always be in what we receive), and after which twelve baskets were accumulated from what remained (we will never run out of the Bread of Life, because Jesus' true presence is always preserved in the Blessed Tabernacle).

The story confirms Jesus' divine power as witnessed by the more than five thousand people in attendance and who were fed, giving credence that He indeed is the Messiah.

The song, "The Supper of the Lord" by Michael Vaughan in its simplicity explains who the Lord is and what He does for us.

Precious body precious blood
Here in bread and wine
Here the Lord prepares the feast divine
Bread of love is broken now
Cup of life is poured
Come share the supper of the lord
This is the bread of God
Coming down from heaven
Giving life to us, to all the world

Jesus Christ loves having a banquet. He gives us everything of Himself. We are always fed physically and spiritually by the grace of God.

The miracle of multiplying five loaves of bread and two pieces of fish to feed five thousand men (and as many as fifteen to twenty thousand people) is one of the most famous in the Gospels. Apart from providing for the physical needs of those present, Jesus also foreshadows the Holy Eucharist. He "multiplies" Himself miraculously by turning bread and wine into His body and blood so that we will be spiritually fed. That is what today's Feast of Corpus Christi, which is Latin for "Body of Christ," calls us to remember.

### HERE'S THE WORD...

### A Brief Commentary on the Gospel

The Gospel Reading concerns Jesus' miraculous feeding of the 5,000 men (not counting women and children). At first glance, this story seems to be only concerned with Jesus' compassion and His supernatural ability to meet the needs of the crowd that came to hear Him preach, but there is much more to understand concerning this event.

Jesus' miracle feedings of the 5,000 men and later the crowd of 4,000 men (Mt 15:38) recalled for the people of His time the past feeding miracles of God and His prophets in the Old Testament. Jesus' two miracle feedings also prefigured His greater miraculous feeding of the disciples with His Body and Blood at the Last Supper, a miracle He promised in His Bread of Life Discourse after feeding the 5,000 (Jn 6:22-65). The continuation of the miracle feeding at the Last Supper is the celebration of the Eucharistic banquet as Jesus continues to abundantly provide for the spiritual nourishment of His Kingdom of the Church in every generation on every Catholic altar. The Eucharistic banquet also anticipates the faithful's participation in the Wedding Supper of the Lamb in the heavenly Sanctuary at the end of time.

Today's remembrance of our redemption through the self-sacrificial offering of Jesus' Body and Blood on the altar of the Cross is an excellent time to recall what redemption means to a Catholic. Protestants believe that God punished Jesus for the sins of humanity and that in Christ's Passion, the Father saw not His divine Son but our sins and vented His wrath upon Jesus. This view of redemption is not what Catholic Christians believe. Jesus did not serve as our penal substitute to receive the retributive punishment for countless lifetimes of sin since the fall of Adam and Eve. God did not abandon Jesus to suffer the fullness of the damnation humankind had earned. Jesus did not take on the world's sins, literally becoming sin Himself. If that were the case, Peter would not have called the Resurrected Christ a "Lamb without blemish" (1 Pt 1:19), and Jesus could not have ascended to Heaven soiled by the sins of humanity.

For the Catholic Church, redemption was and has always been about love. The Father never loved the Son more than as He hung on the Cross. "God so loved the world that He sent his only begotten Son" to give His life for our salvation. Therefore, Jesus was not our substitute; He was our representative. He did not exempt us from suffering; instead, He endowed our suffering with meaning and divine power. Christ's sufferings are not punishments; they were the result of a pure and holy offering of love in obedience to the will of the Father that has extended to every human in every age, including His persecutors. Jesus' act of divine love in offering up His Body and Blood on the altar of the Cross is what makes us a new creation in His Kingdom of the Church! See CCC 613, 616 and the book "What is Redemption?" by Father Philippe de la Trinite, published by Emmaus Road.
