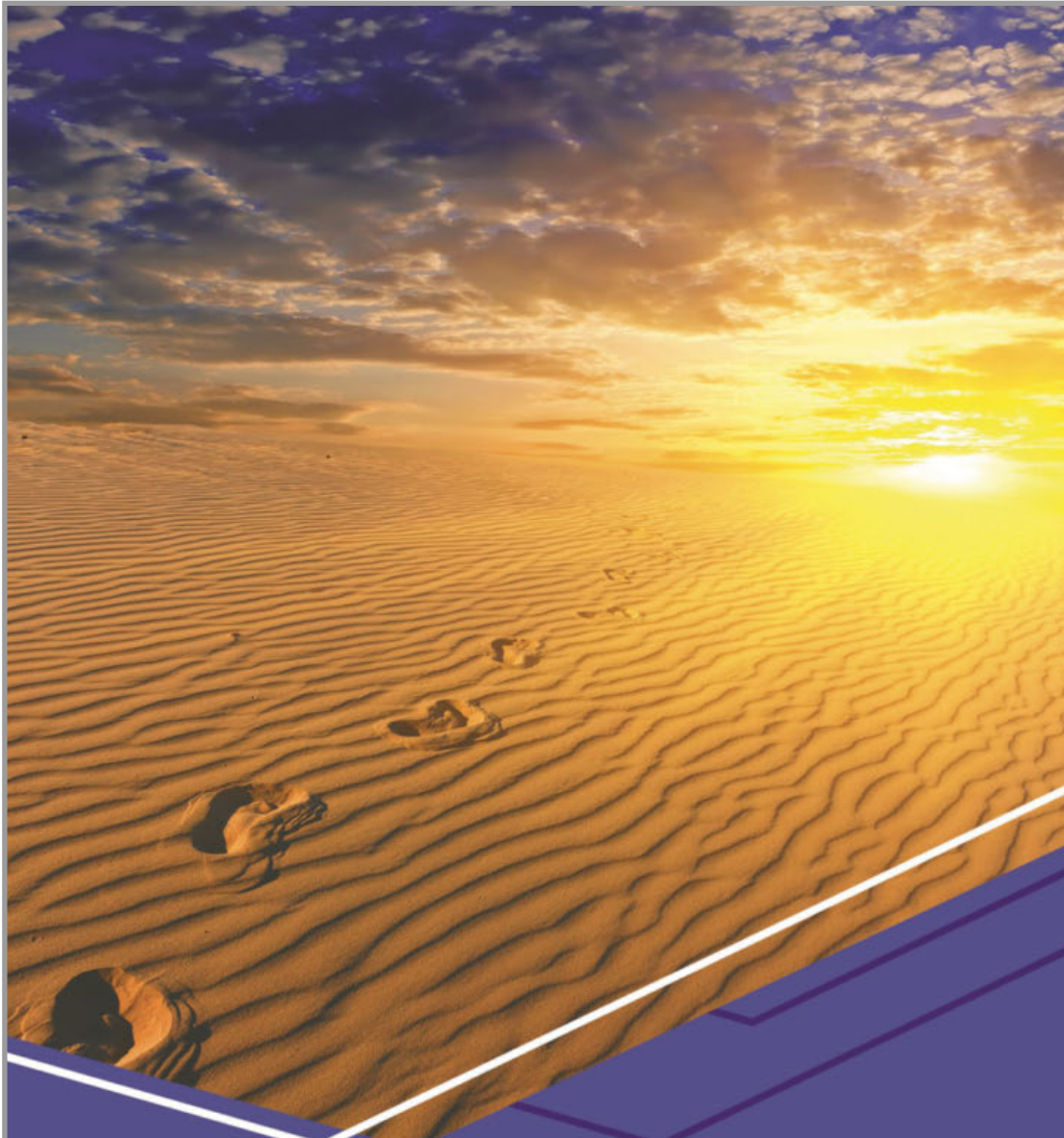

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

And to another he said, "Follow me." In every moment of every day, in every circumstance and experience, God is calling us. We can easily get distracted and not hear it or simply ignore it, pretending it wasn't even heard. When we do hear it and favorably respond, there are some conditions that must be met. Jesus makes it clear that once we say yes to his invitation, we must stay focused and forge ahead. We cannot keep looking behind or worry about unfinished business. There are some tasks, and discipleship is one, that require our full devotion.

There are many "masters" vying for our attention. We need something or someone to give us direction. Human nature requires it. Our motives and actions reveal what has our allegiance. It is tempting to give ourselves to masters that lure us with intriguing promises. When given the choice between a "master" that promises worldly success, abundant wealth, status, privilege, and security versus a "master" that asks for self-sacrifice, hardship, suffering, ridicule, and death, to whom do we go? While the promise of immediate pleasure is enticing, there is always a catch. For all that secular masters can promise, they always keep us looking behind, checking on ourselves, second guessing choices, calculating options, and being slaves to excessive worry. Our guard can never come down. Only one master really promises life: Jesus Christ. Hearing his call, we either trust him or we don't.

Saying yes to following Christ does come with a risk. But it also comes with the brightness of future hopes and dreams. There is no need to keep looking behind. Sins are forgiven and regrets serve no effective purpose. God is not there. He's moved beyond all that stuff. God is in the today and the tomorrow and what he can continually do with our daily affirmation to follow Him. All we need to do is be obedient. St. Gianna Molla is credited with saying, "The stillness of prayer is the most essential condition for fruitful action. Before all else, the disciple kneels down." Begin with prayer. We will not only hear God's call but find the courage to trust that He will guide us where we need to be. God uses us in the most ordinary of ways through the simple daily expression of our lives.

HERE'S THE WORD...

A Brief Commentary on the Gospel

13th Sunday in Ordinary Time Yr. C— “Be Guided By The Spirit” - (Luke 9:51-62)

I invite you to deepen your reflection on today's readings. Consider one or two of these commentaries and reflect on the questions I have posed.

- Elijah is one of the greatest prophets of the Old Testament. But even he gets tired. God tells him to find his successor to continue the prophet's work. In your ministry and service of God, are you 'finding a successor' to share the load and replace you? Have a conversation with God about this.
- Elijah is very wealthy. Most families would own only one ox. He kills 12 oxen and uses farming tools to create a fire. He destroys everything so as to not be attracted back to his old life. He makes a decision that God's work has primacy of place and is the first calling upon his life. Imagine living these actions within your own life and circumstances. What attracts you? In what areas of your life are you not 'free'?
- St. Paul continues to teach the Galatian community about the true nature of freedom. Freedom is really being 'free for others'. To not be attached or enslaved to material possessions and self-indulging desires (flesh) requires discipline and effort. In what area of your life could you make a daily prayer this week for God to help you? Is there an action you could do to enter this particular journey of 'freedom' this week?
- From Luke 9:51 we meet a tougher Jesus. Some texts have Jesus 'set his face like flint' toward Jerusalem. He is determined and makes large demands of his disciples. Going to Jerusalem represents Jesus' obedience to God to do 'his will'. Is there anything you have heard God ask you to do? What will it involve for you to 'set your face' resolutely toward doing it?
- Three unknown people have questions about discipleship in the Gospel. We are invited to hear their questions echo in our own hearts, enter the conversation, respond to Jesus' challenge. Jesus has nowhere to lay his head. Are you free enough to leave home, security, comfort?
- Care for and burial of one's parents was a top social and cultural priority for Jewish people. Allegiance to parents and duties as a child is replaced by Jesus with 'proclaiming the kingdom of God'. What pressures or expectations does society or your family place upon you? Do these 'limit' your freedom to respond to God by living the values and lifestyle of Jesus? How? What will you now do?
- Jesus takes disciples on a special journey toward Jerusalem from this point in the Gospel. There is no turning back. The joy and success of ministry in Galilee changes to resistance by religious people and civil authorities. Jesus urgently teaches his disciples about mission and the Kingdom of God. Imagine a fire is burning and many people's lives are in danger. Would you let go of your 'work' to 'save' these people? Such is the call of the Kingdom of God. How will you respond?
- What is one action that you will do to be "living the Word" this week?

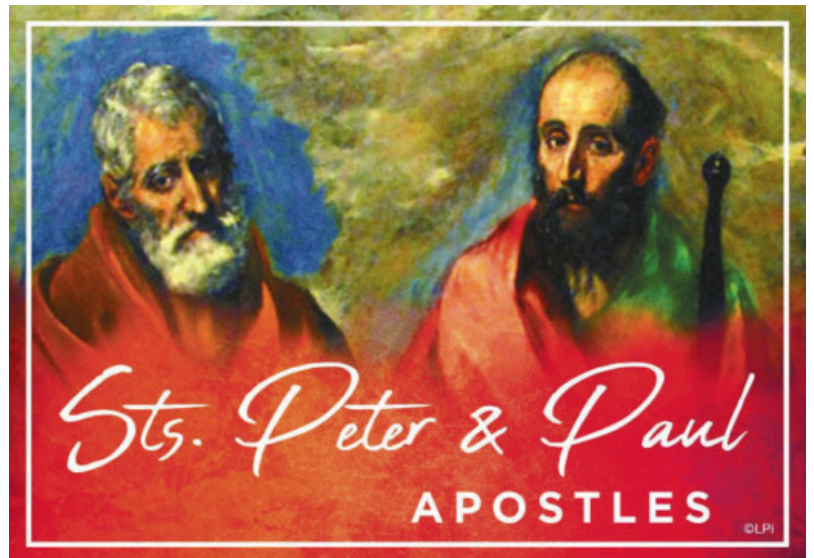
Holy Spirit Preschool—Now Enrolling!
