The Good Samaritan

Our lives are filled with numerous idioms that we use to try and

explain how or why things happen. They have no basis in fact but we use them because it seems to give us a sense of purpose. One of those idioms is "one good turn deserves another." This idiom actually dates back to the 1400's. Today's Gospel reading brought this idiom to mind. We all know the story. The Samaritan helped the stranger after the Priest and Levite ignored his plight.

There are many theological avenues to take on this Gospel. But I am going to wander away from theology for this article.

The part of the passage that has caught my attention and imagination comes at the end. It

is the Samaritan paying the inn keeper for taking care of the stranger. That is easy to understand but the idiom comes into play with the Samaritan telling the inn keeper that he will return and pay for any extra charges that are incurred.

This rescuing the stranger is the "one good turn", but what is the other that is "deserved"? I propose it is the inn keeper who agrees, without any guarantee of repayment, to take care of the stranger. The Samaritan's one good deed engendered the inn keeper's good deed.

Do we do good deeds expecting a return? Or do we just do what is right and let the chips fall where they may? It is my firm belief that doing good deeds just for the sake of helping others will create a domino effect in good deeds happening over and over again. Because, "One good deed deserves another!"

HERE'S THE WORD... A Brief Commentary on the Gospel

15th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (Cycle C) Deuteronomy 30:10-14; Psalm 69:14-15, 17, 30-31, 33-34, 36 or 19:8-11; Colossians 1:15-20; Luke 10:25-37

In the Gospel Reading, Jesus tells the story of a good Samaritan in which He expands the Old Testament commandment to show God's love to one's neighbor beyond the members of the Israelite covenant family.

For the Christian, love of God is not complete without extending His love to our neighbors in the human family. In the last week of His ministry, Jesus will teach that it is our response to demonstrating love in action that will determine our fate at the Last Judgment.

The message for us is that we cannot please God without demonstrating love and compassion to others regardless of whether we think they are deserving of an act of love.

The opening and alternate prayers for our liturgy of worship express all that we should ask of the Lord concerning fulfilling our commitment to the Gospel of Jesus Christ:

"Lord, we pray that "the Gospel may be our rule of life. God our Father, your light of truth guides us to the way of Christ. May all who follow him reject what is contrary to the Gospel."

And the alternate opening prayer concludes with the petition: "May your love make us what you have called us to be."

"And the Word was made flesh...and dwelt among us."

Registration for the 2022-2023 school year will begin in August for our 1st Communion, Confirmation and on-going formation classes.


