FROM THE DESK OF FR. PETER...

My dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

Some of you may know something of my story, of being born and raised in Thailand, and now I stand before you to dwell on today's scripture, especially the Gospel of the day.

Coming to America has been a great blessing and grace for me and for my family also. As I learn and grow and acquire things, as a dutiful son and brother in our family, I share everything with them. Surely that's what we all expect any decent family member to do. Not only do I want my family to be proud of me, I also desire to be equally proud of them.

With the coming of Jesus, the Christ, into our world as a human, he has made us all ONE FAMILY. He has made us all his siblings and, therefore, siblings of each other. So, when I speak to you, I do not see an audience or a crowd of others. I am here with my brothers and sisters in Christ. If blood and flesh bind me so lovingly to the Lawongkerds in Thailand, how much more does the flesh and blood of Christ bind us here now?

Jesus in today's Gospel is asking us why it is that we are so ingenuous, so crafty, so inventive sometimes, or so hardworking and self-sacrificing when it comes to getting material things or transitory joys. But when it comes to the things of heaven, things that are eternal, we are almost indifferent. This is what Jesus was feeling as he addressed his people in our Gospel today. He uses the story of the sneaky steward who was so smart in ensuring his future as was about to be sacked: **"And the Master commended that dishonest steward for acting prudently."**

Now we all know that while we all believe in Jesus and Heaven and eternity, our immediate needs are what feels closest to us. We want to satisfy our pressing needs. This is why we sometimes not only neglect our brothers and sisters in Christ, but we sometimes neglect our very own family, even our children. And this why we are here now, to remember, to pray, to renew our selves, and to be nurtured: nurtured on the word of God, fed with the body and blood of Christ, and reminded by the sight of all our brothers and sisters here present of how wonderful and varied our family is. What is the point of our liturgy, our worship, if it does not affect our lives? It just becomes an empty ritual that makes us feel good.

Friends, we resolve today to keep one another in our hearts, to try to live our daily lives NOT as the Prophet Amos says to us today: **"You who trample upon the needy and destroy the poor of the land."**

But much more as Paul encourages us today: "It is my wish, then, that in every place you should pray, lifting up holy hands, without anger or argument."

HERE'S THE WORD... A Brief Commentary on the Gospel

25th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (Cycle C) Readings: Amos 8:4-7, Psalm 113:1-2, 4-7, 1 Timothy 2:1-8, Luke 16:1-13

The Just Management of Material Blessings

Today's First Reading and the Gospel Reading deal with the issue of the just management of material wealth.

In the First Reading, God sent the 8th century BC prophet Amos to the Northern Kingdom of Israel to condemn those who trampled on the rights of the poor and disadvantaged and promoted illicit worship. Amos courageously confronted the apostate king of the Northern Kingdom and his priests at their shrine at Bethel, telling them that God never forgets unjust acts committed against the poor, and the perpetrators of such abuses, no matter what their station in life, cannot escape His divine judgment.

The Responsorial Psalm reminds us that to God, the lives of the poor are equal in value with the lives of the rich and influential in society. At the end of their earthly lives, God will bring justice to the righteous poor who have experienced temporal suffering. He will lift them from the dust of their humiliation to exaltation in His heavenly kingdom.

In the Second Reading, St. Paul reminds St. Timothy of the importance of offering prayers, supplications, petitions, and thanksgiving for everyone. This form of intercessory prayer should include not only ordinary Christians but also rulers and those in authority because it is God's will that everyone come to salvation through our New Covenant mediator Christ Jesus, who "gave himself as a ransom for all."

Our First Reading prepares us for St. Luke's **Gospel Reading** in which Jesus uses a parable about a dishonest but crafty steward to provide a lesson on the use and abuse of material blessings. Jesus' teaching on the just use of material wealth is that one cannot be disorderly attracted to material wealth and also be a servant of God. The two callings oppose each other. You are either God's servant or a slave to material riches. The selfish and disordered attraction to the accumulation of material blessings without regard for the poor in this life can endanger one's hope of eternal blessings in the next.

Human history has shown that the most practical means of ensuring access to the goods of the earth and the encouragement of human productivity is an ethical system of private property. This privilege derives from the collective right of humanity to subdue the earth in managing and making use of the goods of the land that, along with the blessing of fertility, are God's first gifts to humankind (Gen 1:28). However, the blessing of dominion over the earth is not ownership but stewardship, since God is the Creator, and all the earth belongs to Him. Good stewardship requires us to be ethical in our management of earthly resources, to treat those who work for us with justice by providing them with a fair wage, and to show our gratitude to God for our material blessings by sharing our largess with those who are less fortunate.
