

## FROM THE DESK OF DN. STEVE...

What is the Number One question you would ask Jesus when you meet Him?

Here are several God questions I hear most of the time:

Why does God allow bad things to happen to good people, and good things to happen to bad people?

Why is God not fixing all our worldly problems – Hunger, Violence, Suffering, and War? Why is God not answering my prayers or helping with my family issues, like anger, addiction, mental issues, disabilities, materialism, and moving away from God?

Today's First Reading from Habakkuk (1:2-3; 2:2-4) has your answer, God's answer.

God's answer is so important for us to know, that God had the Prophet Habakkuk write it down "clearly upon the tablets, so that one can read it readily."

If you can, have this First Reading crossstitched or embroidered, framed, and hung on your wall, then pass it down from generation to generation. Or mark this reading in your bible to read when you feel God is not answering your prayers or the world around you is falling apart.

God's instructions in two words: wait and trust. "For the vision still has its time, presses on to fulfillment, and will not disappoint; if it delays, wait for it, it will surely come, it will not be late. The rash one has no integrity; but the just one, because of his faith, shall live."

Our life is a story that needs to unfold over time. There are many moving parts to this masterpiece, each moving at the correct moment. We need to have patience, which requires our faith in God.

God says to us, "Trust me, I know what I am doing."




