FROM THE DESK OF FR. EDDIE...

Be Thankful! Believe and it shall be fulfilled...

"Thank you, Lord!" is an amazing prayer that puts us in our proper place before God. Indeed, Thanksgiving Day is still a month away but our gospel invites us to be thankful for the enormous gift of faith and salvation that we receive from God. Our trusting faith should compel us to gratitude, glory and praise to God for in <u>there is no other God like our God</u>. The remarkable attitude manifested by the grateful Samaritan shows us the deeper connection between faith and the Holy Mass as our highest form of thanksgiving prayer to the Lord.

"Unclean! Unclean!" is a cry of despair by those lepers who are cut off from normal relationships and society during their time. Yet before Jesus, the lepers in their misery, boldly appeal to Him for mercy and compassion. The words coming from their mouths are no longer about their wretchedness but a pleading for healing, **"Jesus, Master! Have pity on us!"** Like the lepers, we have moments in life when we feel our unworthiness before God and others. Time and time again, Jesus envelops us with His love and mercy to renew our whole being, both body and soul. But it is also sad that we seem to be like the other lepers who forget to thank the Lord for the gift of faith, healing, and forgiveness that He has given us. In the gospel, only one returned to express gratitude, and <u>his gesture of humility and</u> gratitude marked a new beginning of his life.

My prayer is that we may learn from the healed leper who thanked the Lord so that every time we celebrate the Holy Mass, we remember, once and for all, the sacrifice of Jesus in Calvary. Together may we raise up our hearts in thanksgiving to Him who loves us so much and who continuously invites to trust in His merciful love. In all circumstances of life, be thankful and believe that our petitions shall be fulfilled, for the Lord of mercy will never fail us.

May our lives become a joyful hymn of praise and thanksgiving! And so with grateful hearts, let us all boldly proclaim God's saving power to the world!

HERE'S THE WORD... A Brief Commentary on the Gospel

28th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (Cycle C) Luke 17:11-19

"Being Grateful to God"

"May our love for you express itself in our eagerness to do good for others" is the petition of our opening prayer in this Sunday's liturgy. Being "grateful" is dependent on remembering all the good things God has done for us, and that "remembering" should generate our thanks and our gratitude to a loving God who calls us His children. We who have been redeemed and have died to sin in Christ (through faith and baptism) should heed St. Paul's last words to St. Timothy: If we have died with him, we shall also live with him. A Christian's life is a sign of gratitude and appreciation for the gift of redemption and the promise of eternal salvation that God has graciously given us.

In the **First Reading**, a Gentile shows his gratitude to God for his physical healing after he bathed in the waters of the Jordan River by making a profession of faith to the God of Israel. The healing waters Naaman experienced were a foreshadowing of Christian baptism in which believers are healed spiritually of the ravages of sin and death to rise out of the baptismal waters, regenerated to a new life in Christ. Naaman's healing foreshadows the spiritual healing Christ offers to all peoples of all nations through the ministry of His universal Church.

The **Second Reading** is from St. Paul's second and last letter to St. Timothy, written from his Roman prison cell shortly before his martyrdom. Paul wants Timothy to understand that the Christian life requires not only a witness for Christ but also endurance and even suffering. Paul follows this hard teaching with the assurance that, even if we stray from the narrow path to salvation, Jesus is faithful in continuing to call His own (those who belong to Him in Christian baptism) to repentance and salvation until they reach the end of their life's journey and join Him in glory.

In the **Gospel Reading**, Jesus heals ten men of leprosy. The only man who returns to thank Him is a Samaritan. When Jesus calls the man a "foreigner," He identifies him as an outsider and not a privileged member of the Sinai Covenant like the other nine Jews He also healed. Jesus judges the man's cry of gratitude and glorifying God as evidence of his conversion and tells him, "Stand up and go; your faith has saved you." Ironically, it is a man who is not a member of the covenant with Israel who returns in gratitude to give thanks to God, while the Jewish lepers did not. It is a sign of future events concerning Jesus and the Jews. The Jews who accepted the gift of healing without expressing their gratitude missed out on the most extraordinary moments of their lives, as will their covenant brothers who reject the Messiah and His works!

The lesson for us is that we must guard against being like the ungrateful nine lepers who accepted the work of God and then abandoned Him in continuing their secular lives. We must strive to be like Naaman the Syrian, to be like the one leper who returned, and to follow the example of the Virgin Mary who demonstrated her gratefulness to God through her obedience and faith. We must acknowledge God's gifts, and we must daily turn back to Him in repentance and gratitude. The Christian walk is one of constant repentance and conversion in seeking out our Lord and Savior, and in giving thanks to Him in the celebration of the Eucharist. We all want to hear those words of Jesus to the one grateful leper on the day of our judgment before the throne of God, "Stand up and go; your faith has saved you."

"And the Word was made flesh...and dwelt among us."


