

FROM THE DESK OF DN. CHUCK...

Sherry's hobby is machine embroidery. She spends countless hours not only operating her machines but also looking up and procuring patterns. She really

enjoys it and has become quite creative in her work. She created a wall hanging with panels depicting Holy Week from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday. It hangs in our home during the Easter season.

I often tease her about the time she spends correcting small errors in the work. I tell her nobody will notice, and her response is, "Maybe no one else will but I will!" I have seen her spend hours taking out her work stitch by stitch until she gets to the place where she can start it again.

I give her kudos for being so persistent. The dictionary defines persistence as "firm or obstinate continuance in a course of action in spite of difficulty or opposition." That is definitely her. Her embroidery can consist of up to the hundreds of thousands of very small stitches. And she wants to make sure when she is finished, it will be to her satisfaction.

We hear that same type of persistence in the Gospel today. The widow is persistent in her pleas to the judge. She wants him to pay attention and provide justice for her. The judge finally relents and makes a ruling. He can no longer resist this widow's persistent pleas.

This story is sandwiched between the lessons that Jesus is providing for his disciples. The passage starts with him telling his disciples to pray always. It ends with telling them that God will give to them what is theirs if they call out to him day and night. He is saying, "Be persistent in your prayers. Do not be afraid to ask God for what you want."

How about you? Are you persistent or do you give up if you don't immediately get what you want? If Sherry was that way in her embroidery work, her finished product would not meet with her own satisfaction. If you do not pray always, will your life meet with your own satisfaction, let alone God's?

HERE'S THE WORD...

A Brief Commentary on the Gospel

29th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (Cycle C)

"Perseverance in Prayer and Scripture Study"

Prayer and studying Sacred Scripture are two ways to grow closer to God and to open the way for God to communicate His divine will to us. The First Reading and the Gospel contain examples of the power of prayer and the necessity of persevering in deepening our relationship with God, and today's Psalm encourages us to pray for God's protection and intervention in our lives.

In the **First Reading**, Moses, in the company of Aaron and Hur, offered an intercessory prayer that resulted in Israel's victory over the army of the Amalekites. Then, the faithful Israelites strengthened each other by praying together, their unity giving additional power to their petitions just as Christians support each other by praying as Jesus told us to pray in His name to the Father (Jn 14:13-14). It is for this reason that the Church, united in the Body of Christ, makes petitions to God in the Intercessory Prayers of the Mass.

The Fathers of the Church saw a foreshadowing of the Christ in Moses standing on the top of a hill/mountain, holding his wooden staff, with his arms outstretched, and praying for victory over Israel's enemy. Jesus prayed for the salvation of humanity on top of Golgotha with His outstretched arms on the Cross. He prayed and ultimately won victory over humanity's perennial enemy, Satan. The Fathers saw Moses' wooden staff as a conduit for God's power in defeating Israel's enemy just as the Cross of Jesus Christ became a channel for God's power in defeating Satan.

In the **Second Reading**, St. Paul advises St. Timothy on the necessity of studying the Scriptures in proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ to his faith community. St. Paul's advice is as crucial for the faithful today as it was in the first century of the Church. St. Paul emphasizes the usefulness of all the Scriptures, and by "all" he means the entirety of the sacred texts that are the word of God written down in human terms that we might understand them and live according to their teachings.

In the **Gospel Reading**, Jesus gives a lesson on the necessity of perseverance in prayer in the Parable of the Persistent Widow. In His teaching, Jesus warns His disciples of every generation to remain firm in their faith. Faith and prayer are two sides of the same coin. If you have faith in God, you will turn to Him in prayer; if you pray, you strengthen your faith in God. At the end of His teaching, Jesus asks the question, will the professed children of God remain patiently persistent in their faith in Him, and will He find faith on earth when He returns?

Ask yourself this same question. Do you persevere in prayer with the persistence of the widow in Jesus' parable or, if you do not immediately receive an answer to your prayer, do you lose heart, patience, and faith, and do you then give up? The reason for unanswered prayer is because we are not praying for what is good for us, or we are praying for what is not in God's divine plan for us, or He is not granting the petition at this time because He is asking us to have patience as He strengthens us spiritually through our perseverance. St. Monica prayed for her son to repent and come to faith in God for almost thirty years. If she had not persisted, the Church might have been deprived of one of her greatest theologians, the Bishop St. Augustine of Hippo.


