FROM THE DESK OF DN. BERNARD...

Let me share with you a story about a young boy who was born having only his right arm. The young boy was under the tutelage of a Japanese judo master, or “sensei”, who taught him a unique and simple judo throw at the beginning of his first week of training.

The second, third, and succeeding weeks came and went, and all the young boy had to do was to continue practicing the same technique over and over again. As time passed, however, he was envious of the other students who were advancing and being taught different techniques, while he was only taught and instructed to learn one move. At one point he asked his master, “Sensei, shouldn’t I be learning other moves?” The master replied to him saying, “Just focus and master this throw. This one move is all you’ll have to know, and you’ll ever need to know.”

After months of preparation, the master brought the young boy to his first tournament. He was quite nervous because the other contenders were highly trained having knowledge of various techniques.

To the boy’s surprise, as well as the audience, he won his first two matches easily. His third and fourth matches were quite hard, but he was able to win the, too, thus, booking himself for the championship round with a bigger and stronger opponent.

Having only one arm and fighting an opponent who was a crowd favorite, the championship seemed to be unfair and overmatched. During a round, the referee called for a time-out and was about to stop the match as he was concerned the young boy would get injured badly, but the sensei intervened and insisted for his protegee to continue.

The match continued. At one point, the young boy’s opponent made a big mistake and dropped his guard. Quickly, the boy used his one and only move to pin the bigger guy and won the tournament.

After the tournament, the young boy asked the sensei what made him win. The sensei told him, “It was due to your hard work, dedication, obedience, and faithfulness in following the master’s instruction. And secondly, the only known defense for the move you learned was for your opponent to grab your left arm” (but the boy didn’t have a left arm!).

Just like the boy in the story, we ourselves can be disabled in other ways. But if we are prepared, disciplined, faithful, and obedient to God, our Sensei and Master, then we will always be ready to face storms, setbacks, trials, hardships that we may encounter in life, and even face death as a victory to be in the heavenly realms with our Creator. In doing so, our weakness will be transformed into our biggest strength.

We hear and see a lot of signs pertaining the end times. NOW is the time to mend our lives to conform to the will of God. We don’t have to waste time by postponing things for tomorrow, for we do not know the time nor the hour when our lives come to an end. One thing is certain, that the end will come at an hour we do not expect. It may not be too far; it may just be a millisecond after this very moment. Let us not waste time! The opportunity for conversion, repentance and reconciliation with the Lord is always available. We just have to be true to ourselves and acknowledge our sins. Make things right and always be prepared to do what is good and what is pleasing in the eyes of God. Jesus is never too far. He is always available whenever we call on Him. “By your perseverance, you will secure your lives”. Our help is in the name of the Lord! Jesus, I trust in you!

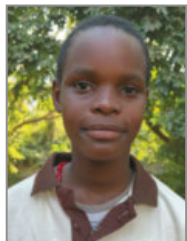

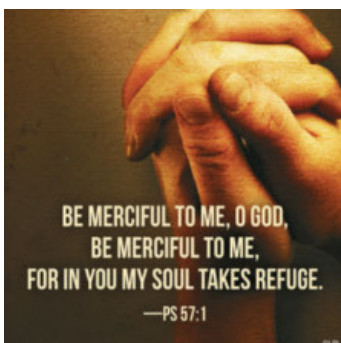

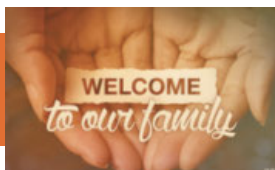
