## FROM THE DESK OF FR. EDDIE...

In Joyful Hope...

We now begin the Advent Season when the Church observes the four-

week preparation for the celebration of Christmas, the birth of Jesus Christ, and also awaiting for the Second Coming of the Lord, the full establishment of the Kingdom of God. So please don't jump yet to Christmas, just like most shoppers and partygoers. The liturgical color of Advent is purple which stresses a certain penitential dimension to this season. Indeed, today's readings suggest the need to stay awake and be ready as we await the coming of the Lord, and the best way to be prepared is the constancy of our faith and profound conversion.

Our lives might be defined as an Advent, as a time of waiting in faith for the saving presence of Jesus into our daily lives and for His triumphant return. Our Savior taught us to pray for the coming of God's kingdom. We are all invited to do our part in building up that kingdom by what we say and do in the ordinary events of our daily lives. In the First Reading, the Prophet Isaiah provides us a splendid and wonderful sight of peace, where the nations of the world live together in harmony under God. When you think of what is happening in our world, it is a reality for which we all yearn to be realized.

During this Advent Season, let us take a moment to ponder on who and what we really are and the way we must conduct ourselves as what Saint Paul says in the Second Reading, "Let us then throw off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; let us conduct ourselves properly as in the day... and make no provision for the desires of the flesh." While thinking about the fact that Santa is coming to town with all the gifts and eggnog, it might be good to think more about Jesus coming into our hearts bringing with Him the Light, Peace and Joy. It is fitting to give ourselves time to remove those that hinder the Lord from coming and to avail of the offering of forgiveness and mercy of God in the Sacrament of Confession.

There is always that tendency to be caught up in the here and now, so the time of Advent is a reminder that we are the people of God who are called to cry out, "Come Lord, come! Maranatha!" Advent is a good reminder. Waiting in joyful hope is what should be our mindset as we gaze constantly on the ultimate horizon which is the coming of our Lord and the fulfillment of what is to come.

Let us prepare with burning passion by keeping ourselves awake and attentive to the many ways that God speaks to us and invites us to follow His ways. Our time of joyful anticipation for the coming of our Lord reminds us not to lose hope in the future. The present situation might be bleak and desolate for it appears to be that we see the endless evils happening within us and in the world, and we tend to see no reason to hope for what is better. The Advent season wants us to see that lesus is surely to come and that a brighter future where Christ will be all in all will be fulfilled in God's saving time.

May we all embrace the Advent Spirit in being attentive consistently to the coming of our Lord! Let our joyful hope of waiting be a moment of building holy lives and committing ourselves to establishing God's Kingdom here on earth! Let our moment of waiting be a recognition that God directs the course of everything!

Beloved friends, I pray that Advent may be a blessed time for you and your families, and that you may feel the presence of the Lord, who is the Prince of Peace and the Light of the World.


