

## FROM THE DESK OF FR. EDDIE...

Beloved parishioners,

The Christmas season is now behind us. We continue our journey as God's people in the Church liturgical calendar known as "Ordinary Time", that is until the arrival of Lent in just over a month's time. I would say, "Ordinary Time is but a call to become extraordinary." It would be a big fault to misunderstand that the Lamb of God whom John the Baptist pointed out is moderately active in Ordinary Time. Indeed, in the ordinary course of events and throughout our lives, the Lord invites us to be extraordinary in offering ourselves in the likeness of Him, the humble and obedient servant as Isaiah described, so that we too could rise up in all circumstances and to conduct our lives in exceptional holiness.

"Here I am Lord, I come to do your will." What a beautiful line in the Psalms which embodies that becoming extraordinary is the sure path to being holy as we make our common pilgrimage towards God. Holiness doesn't just happen; it makes demands on us. We must leave the comfort of what we are familiar with and our well-known ways of responding to God. It is time for us to ponder, to seek and to act all the more in allowing ourselves to be those servants who will lead others to Christ.

Each day of the year ahead is an invitation and

an opportunity to become extraordinarily holy as we are called to reclaim and relive our mission as God's people. It won't be easy and the road that lies ahead does not promise a happy one, but that shouldn't stop us from transforming ourselves in a better direction, even if it is only a small step. As said, "All beginnings start with every first step," and I firmly believe that the grace of God is more than enough to lead us to fulfill the calling of being His servants.

As we come together for Mass at any time of the year, let us remember that no Mass is ever ordinary. With the offering of bread and wine and the rite of consecration, the Lamb of God continues to call us to become a part of His sacrifice on the cross for the salvation of the world. My prayer is that we will respond with a "Yes" by conducting our lives in perpetual holiness so that despite our brokenness, we will be that servant who is brave to say, "To do your will, O my God, is my delight, and your law is within my heart!"

I look forward to getting to know you better in my second year here at Holy Spirit. I am so glad you are part of my journey as a priest! I look forward to making time for you, learning with you, and praying with you. May God bless you all! And remember, God gives us the grace to be extraordinary servants of the Gospel.

### HERE'S THE WORD... A Brief Commentary on the Gospel

2nd SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (Cycle A)

Readings: Isaiah 49:3, 5-6; Psalm 40:1, 4, 7-10; 1 Corinthians 1:1-3; John 1:29-34

Theme: The True Identity of Jesus of Nazareth

Today's Liturgy of the Word reveals Jesus Christ to us in three ways: He is the "Servant" of God promised by the Prophet Isaiah (Is 49:5-6); He is the "Lamb of God that takes away the sin of the world" (Jn 1:29; and He is the "Son of God" (Jn 1:34).

The First Reading is from the second the 8th-century BC prophet Isaiah's four "Servant Songs." Isaiah identified the Servant as God's divine representative, ordained to His mission before His birth to spiritually restore God's covenant people. However, His mission will not be limited to Israel but will include the conversion of the Gentiles for whom He will be a "light to the nation," carrying God's universal message of salvation "to the ends of the earth."

The Second Reading is the introduction to Paul's letter to the Christian community at Corinth, Greece. St. Paul reminds the Corinthian Christians of the three ways in which the existence of church at Corinth is grounded in God's initiative by being sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to a holy life in Christ through Christian baptism, and being members of the universal Body of Christ along with all others who call upon the name of Jesus.

Jesus began His public ministry soon after His baptism by St. John the Baptist in the Jordan River. Our Gospel Reading concerns St. John the Baptist's revelation of Jesus' true identity as the Lamb of God and a sin offering for the atonement and sanctification of the covenant people. John leaves no doubt that Jesus is the promised Messiah, the Servant of the Lord who the prophet Isaiah foretold would redeem Israel. He is the Christ that St. Paul and the other Apostles and disciples served and proclaimed as the One who brings salvation to the world!


