A. Report from the Pastor-Father Ken

Summary: These are the financials for the month of September 2022 the end of the third quarter. September income was slightly higher than budgeted and expenses slightly lower. We remain in good financial health having managed through the pandemic. Now we face a potential recession (always something), we continue onward.

- Top Line YTD
 - 1. YTD income is \$1.772M; 107% of budget (of which \$172k is donations/gifts).
 - 2. YTD Expense is \$2.008M; 104% of budget.
 - 3. Cash balance is approximately \$1.863M. (August was \$1.894M)
- Income for September
 - 1. Total Income for September was \$193k , 112% of budget. (August was \$225k, 90% of budget).
 - 2. Plate collection for September (key indicator) was \$154K or 117% of budget. (August was \$154k, 103% of budget).
 - 3. September income includes new donations of \$7.5k.
 - 4. Facility use (rentals) were \$11k.
 - 5. Faith Formation/Youth Ministries continue with registrations. Income for these accounts is about \$18k.
- Expenses for September
 - 1. Expenses were \$213k, were 96% of budget. (August was \$229k, 115% of budget).
 - 2. Monthly property depreciation of \$38.4k, is included in expense but does not use cash.
- CP Campaign/CP Operations
 - 1. \$24k entry for front entrance

Buildings and Grounds:

- Campus Master Planning Committee (CMPC) We reviewed the Master Plan Design [draft] with CMPC Team on 9/29, and with Parish and School Staff on 10/12. We will present the draft to our community for additional feedback in November, date TBD. (MPD presented to Council at this meeting.)
- Front Entrance Project The design has been changed based on the City's input. The permit set is being revised.
- De Sousa House (DSH) Updating of the AV equipment (aged 15 years) is in process with an emphasis on ease of operation, flexibility, and quality.

- C. Report from the School Principal Holly Marsh
 - Preschool enrollment 34.
 - K-8 enrollment 268.
 - We are focusing on Rosary during the month of October. Students got together with their buddies to make rosary bracelets and to pray the rosary together.
 - We will have a small carnival on Halloween , followed by trunk-or-treat. We look forward to seeing our community coming together for some fun!
 - In November we will participate in Operation Christmas Child. Our goal this year is to connect with various service organizations to help take care of the greater community and to spread the gospel teachings.
