

FROM THE DESK OF SR. KAREN...

This Sunday's readings present us with the reality that we are spiritual as well as physical beings, and even though the physical body dies, the spiritual being continues to live. The

raising of Lazarus was one of Jesus' powerful signs of that reality for all his disciples and us, too.

In my ministry as a hospital Chaplain, God has given me many opportunities to be like Martha and Mary – to send word (prayer) to God, Jesus, and Spirit to come be with a person or family of someone who is sick, injured or dying. The sisters of Lazarus sent the message to Jesus, "The one you love is sick". We don't know how long it took for the message to get to Jesus because of the distance and no cell phones. As soon as Jesus got the message, He saw this as an opportunity for His Father to teach a message about life after death as a way to prepare the apostles and us for His own death, burial, and resurrection. Jesus didn't use the power to heal over a distance as He had done before. His love for Martha and Mary compelled Him to go physically, and His love for them was so strong that He cried even though He knew He was about to give Lazarus back physical life.

Jesus probably remembered the passage from Ezekiel that we hear today in the First Reading about God's promise to open the graves and "have them rise", as He was about to show this to all present at the tomb of Lazarus. Have you had something similar happen in your life? I had a powerful experience of this myself.


An unconscious woman was brought to our hospital in Burlington, Vermont, after she was found in her car off the road in a snowstorm. She had suffered an aneurism of the brain. The car had driven off the road into the woods. It snowed so much that the tracks of the tires were completely covered. Her friend reported her missing and it took many hours before they discovered her car and got her to the hospital. She was in a coma and on life support care for many days. Prayers were being offered by her family, friends, and total strangers who had heard of the story. The staff at the hospital did everything in their power to help her. Our minds were flooded with anxiety and fear during those weeks, but we continued praying with hope and trust. We clung to God's promise of life even in death as her lifeless body lay in the ICU. At long last, she opened her eyes. The respirator was removed, and she spoke, witnessing that her brain function was undamaged by the experience. A true miracle! Because of the cold weather, the aneurism had not bled, so there was no severe damage to the brain and healing was able to happen. God had allowed so many lives to be touched as we prayed for this woman. We all felt truly a part of the miracle God had worked.

This miracle was one powerful sign of what would happen to Jesus in the near future; die, be buried, and come to life again. We believe that this is true for each of us as well. Be open for the miracles around you.



Holy Spirit Parish 2022 Year-End Financial Summary

Following is a summary of Holy Spirit's financials for the 2022 fiscal year. Having gone through several challenging years, our financials continue to be well managed under the direction of Fr. Ken and the staff. Our commitment is to continue to be transparent with the financials of our parish and we thank you for the ongoing and continued support of Holy Spirit. It is through your generosity we have such a vibrant parish. In our summary of financials, we included a comparison of 2022 vs 2021 actuals. Holy Spirit continues to be in good financial health. Some key highlights of the 2022 Financials:

- Income
 - Total Income was \$2.422 M; a slight decrease from 2021
 - Plate collections remained consistent year over year.
 - o Gifts and one-time donations were down compared to 2021.
- · Expenses:
 - Expenses were and continue to be well managed by the Parish staff as all deal with inflationary pressures.
 - Total Expensed increased year over year by approx. \$244K.
- Net Operating Income /Loss
 - For the 2022 fiscal year, Holy Spirit shows a loss of \$306K.
- Key Projects and Achievements
 - Some of the key projects for 2022 include:
 - A site survey of our entire campus.
 - A complete set of as-builts for all buildings on campus.
 - The completion of the Programing for the Campus Master Plan.
 - · The initial draft of the Master Plan.
 - A new PA system for the gym.
 - Complete refresh of AV in the DeSousa House.
- Other Income and Expense
 - We have also included income and expense that were managed by key ministries
 - Total Income and Expense are listed below the target of these ministries is to manage to break even over time.


