

Companion on the Journey

Today's Gospel is one of my favorites. I like to think of these

two disciples, "one named Cleopas" (it was not customary to mention the names of women), as a married couple because when they arrive home in Emmaus, they invite Jesus in to dine with them.

It is so easy to identify with these two disciples discussing their most recent experiences of the arrest, death and burial of Jesus. All their hopes dashed and feeling lost, bewildered, depressed, frustrated! Trying to help each other understand what went wrong, they study the story as they walk along.

Have you ever been so overwhelmed or hurt that you keep going over what happened again and again? Trying to understand what went wrong? Looking for a clue? A glimmer of hope? These disciples are so blinded by their turmoil, caught up in their pain, they do not recognize Jesus. "Are you the only stranger in Jerusalem who does not know the things that have taken place there in these days?" And Jesus replies "What things?" encouraging them to share their stories, to express their feelings of sadness, disappointment, and all that was blinding them


before gently chiding them. "'Oh, how foolish you are!'...Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets," Jesus began revealing the Scriptures about himself, a true companion on their journey.

As Jesus dined with them, "...he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them. With that their eyes were opened and they recognized him, but he vanished from their sight. Then they said to each other, 'Were not our hearts burning within us while he spoke to us on the way and opened the Scriptures to us?" They hurried back to Jerusalem to tell the others what happened on the road and how they recognized him in the "breaking of the bread."

Like these disciples, we all need a companion on our journey. A spouse, a good friend, a mentor, or a spiritual companion. It is so easy for us to bind ourselves and be blinded to the ways God is acting in our lives. How foolish we can be. In spiritual direction, it is the Holy Spirit who does the directing, and the companion helps us to see and reflect the action of the Spirit in our lives.

May you be blessed with a good spiritual companion! May you be able to say, "Was not my heart burning?" And may you recognize Jesus "in the breaking of the bread!"

h, how foolish you are! How slow of heart to believe all that the prophets spoke! Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into his glory?" (Luke 24:25-26)



Live The Liturgy Inspiration of the Week

It wasn't until Christ spoke the words of blessing over the bread that the eyes of the disciples were opened, and they saw him for who he was — God in flesh and blood before them. The Eucharist makes real what we otherwise would fail to see.



Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

I always feel a little sad when someone begins to speak to me with the words, "Father, I know you're so busy, but ..." It happens a lot. And I get it. He or she is trying to be respectful of my time. But it saddens me because a priest makes Jesus present to people in a special way, and Jesus *always* has time for us. Don't we all feel at times that God just doesn't have time for us?

Nonsense. Just look at the stunning "Road to Emmaus" story we hear this week. It's the day Jesus rose from the dead. And the Risen One appears in disguise to two disciples. He walks with them, chats with them, and eventually eats with them. It could have been hours he spends with them — two unnamed persons — in the middle of nowhere. On the day he rose from the dead!

My friends, please take this to heart: The Risen Jesus is not too busy to spend time with you! He doesn't have "better things to do." You and I are members of this crucified and risen Body. He therefore has all the time in the world to be with us. So, I challenge you this week to approach him confidently in prayer and conversation. After all, being with you and me is the reason he rose from the dead.




