FROM THE DESK OF DN. STEVE...

Annette and I pray that everyone reading this is doing well. Always keep your faith strong, and pray, pray and pray to support our brothers and sisters.

The First Reading today, Acts 6:1-7, is one of my favorites, about the formation and necessity for deacons to attend the needs of those who are often overlooked, such as the widows who had no one to protect and speak for them.

The Apostles' ministry was focused on prayer and preaching the word. Creating deacons helped the Church grow and mature, and broadened ministries to serve and support our brothers and sisters, especially those in need.

What is a deacon in our Catholic Church today? There are two types of deacons.

Transitional deacons are seminarians who are preparing for the priesthood. After being a transitional deacon for 6-12 months, they are ordained a priest by the bishop.

Permanent deacons are men with no intention or desire to become a priest. They can be single or married. If a man is married, he must have already been married for a time before being ordained a deacon. If his wife dies, the deacon cannot remarry, unless approved by the Vatican for special reasons, such as having young children. With the approval of the bishop, an unmarried or widowed deacon may choose to start the process for them to becoming a priest.

Personally, I have only seen this once; a single, unmarried man who was ordained a permanent deacon then later asked and was granted to become a priest, Father Jimmy.

Deacons serve in several capacities. Most people see deacons serve at Mass. Deacons can also: baptize; witness marriages (outside of the Mass); perform vigils, funeral, and burial services (outside of the Mass); distribute Holy Communion; visit the sick; provide spiritual direction to couples and individuals; serve on parish committees and councils; and advise the pastor when asked.

As Ministers of the Word, deacons proclaim the Gospel, preach, and teach in the name of the Church. We also administer Communion services (outside of the Mass), and we lead the faithful in prayers.

As Ministers of Charity, deacons lead in identifying the needs of others, and work with parish resources to meet those needs. We are social justice warriors, there for others through their journey in life, always reminding people how much God loves them.

Deacons do not get paid and there is no 401K. We all have regular jobs, many of us work the usual 40hour week, and most of us have families we a responsible for.

We love to teach our faith, help where we can, and we are there for others when needed.

What are the main differences between ordained deacons, priests and bishops?

The top three differences are regarding the sacraments. Only priests and bishops can consecrate the bread and wine, which become the Body and Blood of Christ in the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. Priests and bishops can hear and forgive sins in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. And only priests and bishops can administer the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick.

The Bishop oversees the deacons. He ordains us and assigns us to a parish. Here at Holy Spirit, we are mentored and supervised by our pastor, Father Ken.

What I have learned from being a deacon is that our work and ministry are not always what we do, but who we are.

May God's Love continue to grow in your hearts and actions.


