FROM THE DESK OF SR. KAREN...

Greetings!

As Christians, we believe in a God called Most Holy Trinity. This weekend, we celebrate this, so

let's take time to think deeply about what this means for us.

What does that mean for you, for me?

Over the years, I have come to know and love God as I was taught in the catechism in ever deeper ways. As a child, God was my Creator (Abba/Mama, Divine Parent), but sometimes I felt that I was being watched by a God who was like a police person, to catch me in any failure. I knew that God loved me and gave Jesus to show me how to live. In Jesus, I experienced a God with flesh on. His way of life drew me to dedicate my life to serving God doing good for others. As a teacher, I helped children and parents in California, Oregon, and Hawaii grow in faith. Later, after a deeper experience of God's presence with me, I became a hospital chaplain. I became more aware how God's intimacy with each one enables us to do things we never thought we could do.

Over the years, my knowledge and understanding of God changed, deepened, and became a more personal relationship with a Spiritual Being of three persons – a Creator, a Redeemer, and Sanctifier – each person closely one with the other that all work together. God truly is a relationship of love, a love so intense that the universe was created and is continually being supported and renewed moment by moment.

Science is helping us see the interconnectedness of all things. God continues creating and causing growth, and from the death of anything, new life emerges.

I encourage us all to be open to the ways the Trinity makes Abba, Jesus, and Spirit present in our lives, in nature, in people, in experiences, and in our prayer. (The radiance of Abba in a sunset, the compassion of Jesus in a mother, the inspiration of the Spirit in a time of crisis.)

"May God awaken our hearts to the divine presence that surrounds us, and teach us to recognize Christ in one another, by the power of the Holy Spirit. Amen." (Give Us This Day, May 2023, pg. 115)

God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him.



Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

In my experience, one of the peculiarities of being a man is the somewhat unlikely ability to look into the mirror, no matter how out of shape he may be, and declare with full confidence: "Looking good, buddy!" Ask a man. He'll probably confirm it.

Therein lies a mystery. You might think I refer to man's ability to deceive himself or his propensity toward vainglory. But in this case, I refer to the mystery of a healthy and proper sense of self-love. We human beings (both men and women) have the utterly weird ability to look at ourselves as if we were another. Then we tend to love this "other." Then, somehow, that love becomes a bond between the two. We are three and yet one.

This Sunday is Trinity Sunday. We ponder anew that God in His unity is a play of multiplicity: Lover, Beloved, and shared Love. Or, as we also proclaim, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. If we allow it, this mystery heals our temptation toward selfhatred and destruction. We all know how awful it is to look into the mirror and not know the person we see, or, equally bad, to know and hate who we see. Jesus, the Son of God, draws us into the dynamics of authentic self-knowledge and self-love. Perhaps we could ask the Holy Trinity this Sunday to teach us to truly look at ourselves and to properly love who we see looking back.






