

From the Housetops

Even though this gospel passage (Matt 10:26-33) begins with


"Fear no one," my immediate reaction to "nothing is concealed that will not be revealed, nor secret that will not be known" and "what you hear whispered, proclaim on the housetops" is "Oh, no!" I don't know about you, but my ego immediately jumps into action, puts up defenses and rebels, because there are things in my life that I would prefer to keep secret. I regret the things I have said and done that are the sources of my shame. While I do not fall into the paranoia of Jeremiah in today's first reading (Jeremiah 20:10-13), I believe that the "Lord is with me" and to God "I have entrusted my cause."

"We believe that every person is made in God's image and is already God's beloved because God made that decision eons ago" (Vinita Wright). Yes, eons ago. God has loved us into being and sustains us each moment with every breath and every heartbeat. "All the hairs of your head are counted. So do not be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows." Love conquers all fear and that is what must be proclaimed from the housetops. The terrible thing about sin is, God is loving and sustaining us even while we are sinning. A parent does not stop loving a child because of a lie or evil deed but rejoices when the truth comes out and sorrow is expressed. The goodness of such a parent is a reflection of our God who is Goodness Itself. Our Scriptures are filled with stories of forgiveness when one turns away from wrongdoing. We have only to recognize our shame and sorrow in asking for forgiveness. Remember the Prodigal Son?

The way I tame my eqo is to recall passages like "I chose you, I have not rejected you-Do not fear: I am with you; do not be anxious: I am your God." (Isaiah 41:10) "You are precious in my sight ... and I love you." (Isaiah 43:4) Recognizing that there is nothing I have done or could do to earn or deserve God's love: that all is grace and sheer gift; that God's love is everlasting in spite of me—I find myself in a place of total submission. The refrain "You are all we have, you give us what we need, our lives are in your hands, O God, our lives are in your hands" (Francis Patrick O'Brien) becomes my mantra. This refrain is what needs to be sung from the housetops. Will you join me in this song?

May you always recognize God loving and sustaining you! May you be a reflection of God's goodness in your life! And may you sing of God's love for you from the housetop!



Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

When I was in middle school, there were times I didn't want my fellow students to see my parents drop me off or pick me up in the school parking lot. I was embarrassed of my parents. Why? I have no idea. Maybe it was our station wagon. Or I didn't want to look like a little kid. But in retrospect that was a silly thing to do. I was a kid. And I had two parents who loved me and had built a wonderful family. I was afraid of the other kids' judgment. How silly! I should have been afraid of forgetting or downplaying my family, which is where my identity had its deep roots.

This is a way to understand Jesus' words to his disciples this Sunday, when he says, "**Don't be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna.**" Fear, in this sense, refers to where we find our deepest identity and our highest love. That's why Jesus says next that when we acknowledge him before others, he will acknowledge us before the Father. It doesn't mean we're brash or boastful. But rather we unhesitatingly and humbly embrace our identity as followers of Jesus and children of God the Father. After all, if we love who we are and where we come from, who cares what the other kids think about us?

Saint of the week

Venerable Pierre Toussaint was born into slavery but became an elite hairstylist in New York City and a free man. He used the money he earned to transform the lives of impoverished New Yorkers, former slaves, and immigrants alongside his wife, Servant of God Juliette.

Prayer

Lord God, source of love and compassion, we praise and honor You for the virtuous and charitable life of our brother in Christ, Venerable Pierre Toussaint.

Inspired by the example of our Lord Jesus, Pierre worshipped You with love and served Your people with generosity. He attended Mass daily and responded to the practical and spiritual needs of friends and strangers, of the rich and the poor, the sick and the homeless of the 19th century, New York.

If it is your will, let the name of Venerable Pierre Toussaint be officially raised to the rank of Saint, so that the world may know this Haitian New Yorker who refused to hate or be selfish, but instead lived to the full commandments of heaven and the divine law of love — love for God and for neighbor.

By following his example and asking for his prayer, may we, too, be counted among the blessed in heaven.


