

# **NOURISH**



FROM THE DESK OF BR. RONALD...

How's your summer going, Holy Spirit family?

Summer vibes render a feeling of fun and flourishing. It seems that everything around us whispers to engage in some outdoor activities under the bright sun.

Today's readings bear a summery theme on sowing, growing, and expecting to yield a good harvest. In a spiritual sense, we Christians are called to allow God's word to grow in us, glow Christ-like love through actions, and go to the mission field where He calls us to serve.

In the First Reading, Prophet Isaiah illustrates the importance of moisture brought about by rain and snow which causes the life on earth to thrive, "giving seed to the sower and bread to the eater." Additionally, this reading teaches about the lifegiving Word of God which He sends out to produce fruit. Thus, the Word is meant to deliver and complete according to God's purpose, "My Word accomplishes everything." The Word brings forth repentance, faith, and salvation from God.

In the Second Reading, St. Paul writes a letter of hope addressed to the Romans. He imparts that the sufferings the early Christians endure are nothing to compare to the glory to be revealed by Christ. And so for us, there is hope found in Christ amidst our sufferings. This hope sustains us and

the whole creation as we actively wait for Christ's return.

In the Gospel Reading, Jesus teaches us about the nature and the principles of the Kingdom of God through the Parable of the Sower (Matthew 13:1-23, Mark 4:1-20, Luke 8:4-15). Jesus explicitly conveyed the meaning of the parable. The seed is the word of God. The different soils represent diverse ways which we receive the word of God. More often than not, we ponder on this parable by identifying ourselves with either a particular type such as the path, the rocky ground, the thorny field, or the good soil. It is likewise conceivable that all four soil types are in us. The parable emphasizes the importance of having a receptive heart and cultivating a profound understanding of the word of God.


Keenly, it is very striking that the sower scattered seeds on all types of soil. This leads us to basically ask, "Does the sower know what he's doing?" "Why didn't he just sow onto the good soil?"

Perhaps Jesus intends that we likewise reflect on the all-embracing loving quality of The Sower – God. He does not choose whom to love. There is nothing that separates us from His love (Romans 8:31). He just loves. He continues to sow whatever it takes. He meets us where we are and leads us to the right path until we become a "good" soil and produce a bounty. Now that is the good news!

# Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

It's not uncommon to hear people complain that we Catholics often fail in communicating our faith. Fair enough. We can and should improve there. But it's interesting to notice that Jesus himself was implicitly accused by his disciples of a similar failure. This week in Matthew's gospel they are perplexed that he speaks to the crowds in ambiguous parables. The Lord's riddles leave many people more confused than before. He responds by pointing out that his parables have an intentional dual purpose: to hide (for some) and to reveal (for others) his Gospel: "Because knowledge of the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven has been granted to you, but to them it has not been granted" (Matthew 13:11). Is Jesus being unnecessarily difficult, obscurantist, or, worse, elitist?

No. We have to remember that all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge lie hidden in him (c.f., Col. 2:3). He is the word of God from heaven to be planted in the earth of our humanity to bear great fruit. However, like a lover delicately pursuing his beloved, we're dealing with a relationship, not new data. When we aren't willing to personally accept Jesus into our lives, the "info" of the Gospel will simply not make sense to us. It'll seem bizarre, esoteric, or like incoherent religious-speak. But when we are willing to accept Jesus into our lives, everything else starts to make sense. When others don't understand the Church or the Lord, let's be patient. Love is patient. Sometimes it has to hide before it is revealed.




