

# FROM THE DESK OF SR. KAREN...

In today's readings Jesus shares a parable with the chief priests and elders of the people. And it has a familiar ring to them because they

are those who know the Scriptures best. They have reflected and discussed Isaiah's words about the vineyard. Jesus makes a switch in the story though. This is a story about the people of Israel and how they have acted through the years. The Israelites were aware that God gave them everything - as was mentioned in the two stories. As the chief priests and elders listened, I am sure they could resonate with the examples he gave of the tenants' treatment of the servants of the landowner.

God desires us all to live lives of justice and compassion and their treatment of the servants was far from just or compassionate. I wonder if the Lord hoped to open their eyes to what they were doing and might change their minds about their behavior. Maybe we need to think about how we have used God's gifts in our lives.

Most faith traditions have a similar belief of, "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you." We are invited to treat each other justly and with compassion. As Jesus walked the roads of the Holy Land, He showed us all how to live that way. When we live our lives in reverence and care for all of God's creation, when we are just in our actions and follow the Lord's guidance, we will bear fruit and dwell in the kingdom of God.

We are the vineyard of the Lord as Psalm 80 states. Help us call to God more clearly for the love and healing we need to be people of mercy and compassion.






