FROM THE DESK OF FR. BINH...

Repay God What Belongs to God!

When I was a boy, I had to attend Mass every day, as a custom established by my parents before I was born. People told me that my parents took me to church regularly when I was a baby. Our parents helped us get used to this good habit before they asked us to practice it. Everyone in my family had to complete this requirement, no question. The Mass took place after school, and the church was nearby, so my siblings and I would walk there.

I must confess that I was not a pious boy. I sometimes felt lazy and told my mom I was under the weather. My mom touched my forehead to feel the temperature and decided whether I could be permitted to stay home. The excuse of illness did not always work.

After dinner was the time for homework and evening prayer at home. Everyone knew this schedule. However, when I did not want to attend Mass, I brought my schoolwork to my mom before Mass. I asked her if I could miss Mass to finish it. I put before my mom the choice between my schoolwork and spiritual duty.

The Gospel for the 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time tells us about a drama between Jesus and the Pharisees. The Pharisees came to Jesus with flattery and pretended to seek His counsel. They gave Jesus the option of choosing Roman law and paying taxes to Caesar or choosing the religion of the Jewish people. They wanted to entrap Him, which, of course, didn't work.

Surprisingly, Jesus had a straightforward answer, "...repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God."

Jesus did not base His argument on public institutions: the Church versus the State. He did not talk about the political issues. Instead, He spoke about His justice. Caesar had to receive what belonged to him. Pay him what he deserves.

And Jesus tells us today that we must also pay God what we owe Him. We often pay government taxes well and on time but, sadly, forget our duties to God. Like the Pharisees, we sometimes propose to God a choice between being faithful to Him or a secular state.

We owe God our love. God loves us every moment of every day and night. It is only suitable that we love Him back.

The State requires us to pay taxes. Likewise, God demands a spiritual tax. God's tax requirement for us is to love Him and our brothers and sisters.

*"You shall love the Lord, your God,
with all your heart,
with all your being,
with all your strength,
and with all your mind,
and your neighbor as yourself."*

We don't have to worry if we take care of our spiritual tax requirements. We will be blessed if we do our best to love God and our neighbors. Saints must have paid significant spiritual taxes to God. They repaid their love to God and their neighbor as God asked them, and now they are experiencing eternal joy in Heaven.

Prayer for Radical Solidarity

O Blessed Mother, at the angel's word you went in haste to the aid of your cousin Elizabeth. Although pregnant yourself, you placed her needs before your own.

By your example of radical solidarity, teach us to reverence and protect those in need, without conditions or expectations. Ask your Son to give us unfailing determination to witness to the profound dignity of every person, at every stage and in every circumstance.

In that first Eucharistic procession, you carried Jesus to Elizabeth in her time of need. Obtain for us the grace to bring Christ to any expectant mother who is alone and afraid.

May our support help them to find hope and strength in the Lord. Amen.

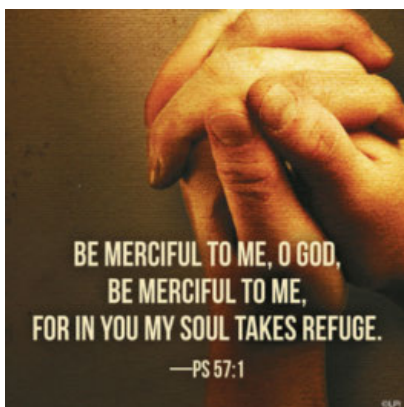

Top Reasons to Oppose Assisted Suicide

The deadly and dangerous practice of assisted suicide is now legal in five states* (Oregon, Washington, Vermont, California, and Colorado) and the District of Columbia, our nation's capital. With new momentum and lots of money, assisted suicide proponents are pursuing an aggressive nationwide campaign to advance their agenda through legislation, ballot measures, litigation, and public advertising, targeting states they see as most susceptible to their message.

Some polls indicate that the public is receptive to the general concept of assisted suicide. But the same polls show that when the public learns about the dangers of assisted suicide, especially for those who are poor, elderly, disabled, or without access to good medical care, their views shift against the practice.
