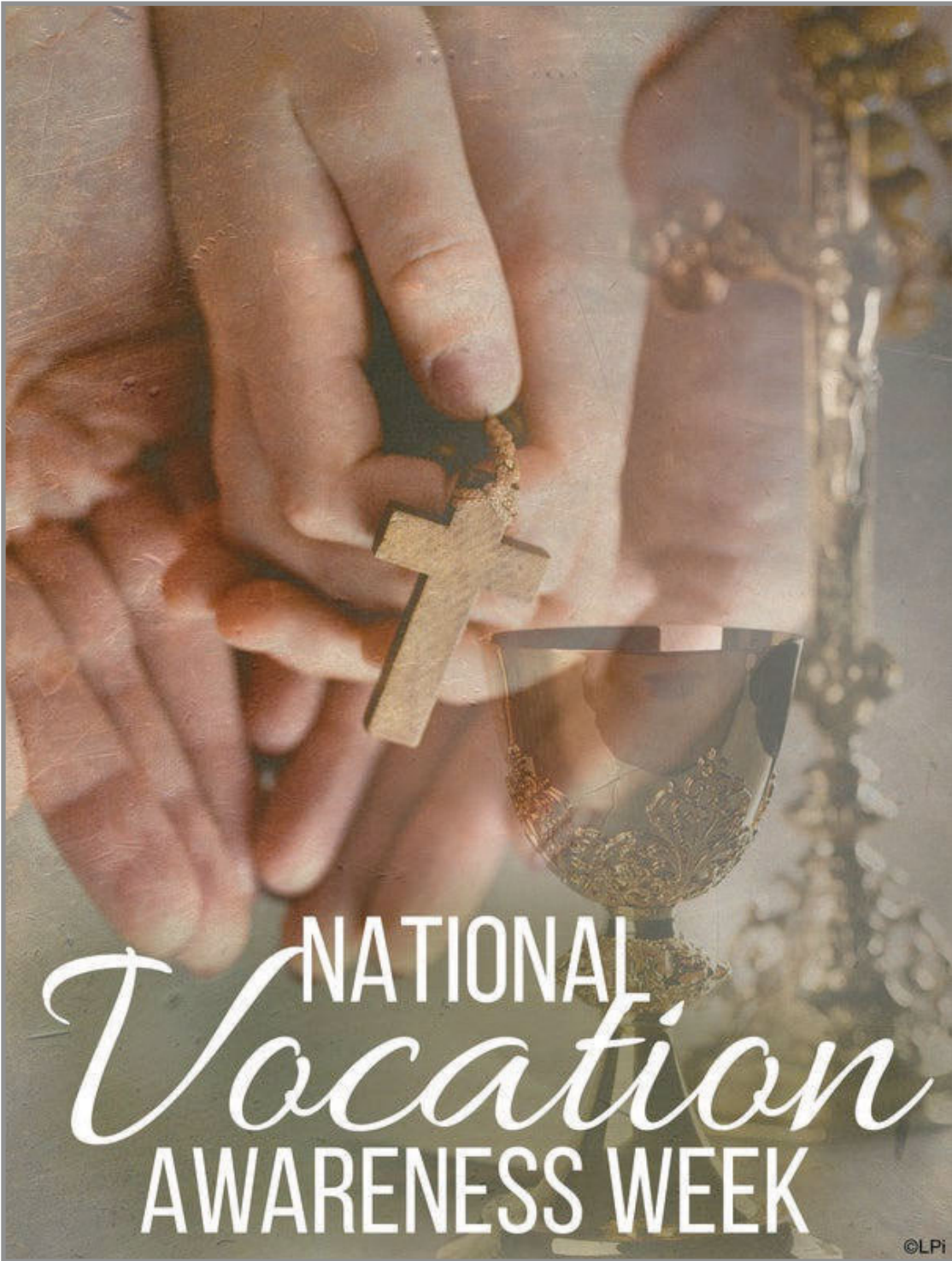

FROM THE DESK OF DN. BERNARD...

During my ordination rite as a deacon, I had to kneel before Bishop Michael Barber, SJ, (a sign of obedience & surrender) as he presented to me the Book of the Gospels with this particular instruction:

“Receive the Gospel of Christ, whose herald you now are. Believe what you read, teach what you believe, and practice what you teach.”

As a herald of the Gospel, I am required to hold it dearly in my heart, to effectively proclaim the Gospel by Word, through love, humility, and service, which are fundamentally rooted to Jesus Christ. A herald is one who announces, proclaims, or delivers good news (Remember the song: “Hark the herald angel sing, glory to the newborn King...”). To be able to make God’s Word alive, I have to live my life in a proper conduct. I can never be an instrument to convey the goodness of God and to expect others to believe if I don’t live my life in accordance with what I proclaim. As a member of clergy, I should never think proudly of myself, of status nor recognition. Yes, it can be tough and a lot of times I fall short, I stumble and fall. Does this make me a hypocrite? The Lord will be my judge.

We become hypocrites whenever we pretend to be something we are not. Sometimes we say one thing and then do the opposite. Christians that we are, we must follow the example of Jesus Christ. It doesn’t matter where we are or who we are with. The words we speak and the things we do should always reflect our faith. Sometimes we are good at instructing other people what they should be doing and how they should live their lives, but we fail to follow our own directives.

Practice what you preach.

It is said that “practice makes perfect”. We could also say that practice bears fruit, and perfect practice bears very good fruit. ‘Practice what you teach’ applies not only to deacons, priests, and bishops, but to all baptized Catholic Christians and, in fact, to every human being. Just like in our own families, parents can’t expect their children to do what is right if they themselves don’t show it. We can only reflect Christ’s image if we allow ourselves to mirror Him in our lives. We should walk the walk, and not just talk the talk.

“What you see is what you get.” Our words and actions must be the same way wherever we are. When people see us, they should see a reflection of Christ, a compassionate, merciful, and loving person.

Jesus talks about the importance of **acting in ways that are consistent with our faith**. Matthew reminds us that those who would be leaders among us must, like Jesus, be servants to all. To be good and effective leaders, we must be humble servants. “Whoever exalts himself will be humbled; but whoever humbles himself will be exalted.”

Please pray for all the clergy, that we will be enabled by the Holy Spirit to always practice what we teach, that in doing so, we will be able to bring the Good News with greater impact to many souls that still hunger and thirst for the living God. We pray that your faith, and ours, will be shown in all that we do.

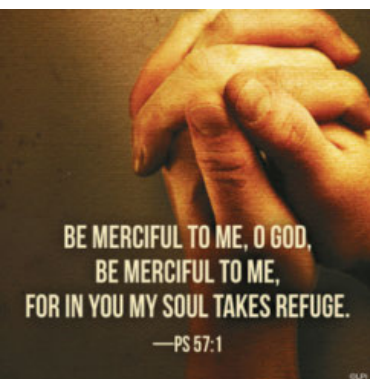
