

## FROM THE DESK OF DN. STEVE...

Today we celebrate the Epiphany, the day Christ is made known to all people.

The Magi, or kings from the East, followed a star that led them to the Baby, Christ, so they could pay Him homage. How did they recognize this star?

We see stars at night, when there is very little or no light around us. When I go on my Shasta fishing trips, we are out in the middle of nowhere. No lights around us, pitch darkness. Yet when we look up at the sky, we see many, many stars. I am sure that in our lifetimes we have seen constellations or have connected the stars; we see a pattern that looks like the Milky Way, Big Dipper, Orion, etc.

Stars come out at night, our quiet time. Unlike our daytime, when we get busy, shopping, cleaning, catching up with friends, and working, so we are easily distracted. I personally love writing my homilies late at night when everyone is in bed. This is the time when my mind relaxes, and all the day noise is gone. It is at this quiet time that I really hear God's call. It is at this quiet time the Holy Spirit gives me thought and direction.


Do we ever see signs that point us in a certain direction? Does our faith in God allow us to move in this direction? And when we move in this direction, are we easily distracted or rerouted?

Maybe this is why the Magi followed the star, which was at night, allowing God to guide them through all the noise, issues, hazards, or daily distractions. By their faith, they found their way to our Savior and presented Him with gifts.

I urge you to share a God-given gift with others. Do this as evidence of your faith in Christ, and let us start our New Year off in the right direction, the Christ direction.



#### Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

A stranger in a foreign land, I was exhausted and homesick as my summer Spanish immersion ended in Guatemala. The rusty minivan arriving outside my small residence filled me with joyful hope. I was flying home to the U.S. and would be, at long last, completely happy. Or so I thought. After about half an hour of being home, I thought to myself, "This place is boring. I want to go somewhere." So, I hopped in my car and left to see my friends. As I drove, I wistfully wondered, "Where am I truly at home?"

The feast of Epiphany has a lot to do with our notion of home. Where is our origin? Where are we going? When is our wandering done? Saint Matthew tells us of the Magi, **"They were overjoyed at seeing the star."** This star will bring them home, to a place where their questing will end, and they will be satisfied. Their real home is neither in the East nor in the earthly Jerusalem. Somehow, their home is wherever this boy and his parents are.

If you're a teenager or older, you probably know by now that every physical home we have is temporary. So, we look up at the countless stars in our proverbial skies: things which bedazzle and beckon us to follow toward peace. The Gospel invites us to behold that — at long last — God has sent us a star to follow home, one that whispers, "Follow me! I will take you home!" Perhaps that star is your spouse. A friend. An opportunity. A cause. An intuition about a new direction. A prayer group. What is it for you? How will you know? It will lead you to Mary and Joseph and their son, and you will be home.


