FROM THE DESK OF FR. EDDIE...

Dear Friends of Christ,

Our Lenten journey has brought us to the pivotal point of our liturgical year that is the Holy Week, a time when we are to remember and ponder the events that led to the culmination of Jesus' mission here on earth. His final hour attained its pinnacle at Calvary when He gave His very life to redeem us as an expiation for our sins and His Easter victory which conquered death forever.

This Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion, we remember the triumphal entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem riding on a donkey as the people waved palm branches and hailed him as "Son of David!" In the same liturgy, we are to reflect on a more melancholic and poignant narration of the Passion of our Lord. It makes me wonder that the crowd who shouted "Hosanna" were also the same ones who screamed "Crucify Him." For me, it reveals our human tendency to waver in our fidelity and love in relation to God.

Days after, we will begin the Easter Triduum with Holy Thursday which brings the memory of the Lord's Supper with his closest disciples in the Upper Room. In this mass, we will do what Jesus mandated us, that is to wash one another's feet with the ritual enactment of the "mandatum." In this gesture, we are all reminded to live a life of selfless service by reenacting in a dramatic manner of being a servant who is willing to get on his knees and wash the dirty feet of others. We also give thanks to Jesus for the gift of the institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper and for the gift of priesthood. Our Mass will conclude with the singing of the beautiful chant, "Pange Lingua," as we process the Eucharist around the church and to the altar of repose in our parish gym. On that note, we are all invited to spend time in adoration before the Blessed Sacrament from 9:00 to 11:00 pm, concluding with Night Prayer.

On Good Friday, our church offers four services, namely at 12:00 noon, 4:00 pm, 6:00 pm and 8:00 pm, which include the narration of the Lord's Passion, Veneration of the Cross, and concluding with Communion Service, the sharing the precious body of Christ consecrated the evening before as a reminder of Jesus' enduring presence and love. We also have the Stations of the Cross after the noontime service and the start of the Divine Mercy Novena at 3:00 pm. The statue of the Dead Jesus the

Nazarene or "Poong Nazareno" will be processed inside the church and be placed near the sanctuary of the altar after each service for us to reflect on the Lord's tremendous love to us by His death on the cross.

Holy Saturday is customarily a "day of silent waiting" which paves the way to the Great Vigil of Easter starting at 8:00 pm, during which the new fire is blessed, and the Paschal Candle is lighted from the fire. On this most holy night of all nights, the ancient hymn "Exsultet" will be chanted to recall God's saving actions after the fall of Adam and Eve. Then together, we remember the salvific history of humanity from the Old Testament readings from Creation, the Exodus, and the words of the prophets who foretold our salvation. The liturgy continues with the return of Gloria and then the Alleluia, having been silent throughout the season of Lent. The gospel is proclaimed with the narration of the Lord's resurrection on Easter morning. Then as God's people, we will welcome through the Sacraments of Initiation those who would become new members of the Church. Along with them, all of us will renew our baptismal promises to reject sin, and to confess our faith in the Triune God, followed by the lighting of candles and sprinkling of the holy water.

This Holy Week, which concludes with the Easter glory, prompts me to ask: *What drives Jesus to embrace the suffering and death on the Cross?* The answer is LOVE. It arises from Jesus' love to His Father and His love for us. He fulfills the will of the Father to become the sacrificial lamb that will bear all our infirmities and to give His life as a ransom from our slavery of sin. The passion of Jesus to do the will of God and to make His life as love personified should capture us during this Holy Week, so much so that we will renew our lives.

As we contemplate the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus, it is necessary for us to remember that Jesus did not die in Calvary only because of the cruelty and evilness of humanity. What drives Jesus to take our sins and to be crucified is His burning love for His Father and for us. It is my hope and prayer that we will take Holy Week seriously and immerse ourselves deeply into the Easter Triduum, that in doing so, we may have the same passion as our Lord Jesus in our love to God and to one another. I fervently hope and pray that you will come for these significant liturgies as possible in remembrance of the Lord's Paschal Mystery – His Passion, Death, and Resurrection.

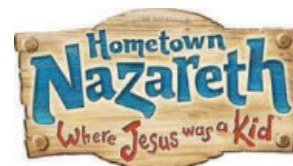
