

Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Once a man came to the Vatican and asked to see Pope John Paul II, claiming that they had been friends in Poland. When told of the man, the Pope said, "He is mistaken about our friendship. I don't recall ever having suffered with him." As it turned out, the man had never known the Pope. Now, I'm not sure if the story is totally factual. But doesn't the juxtaposition of *suffering* with *friendship* sound exactly like JPII? He understood that the deepest and most lasting friendships are forged in the fires of shared suffering. No suffering, no friendship. Amazing.

This week we hear Jesus say to the apostles and to us, "You are my friends if you do what I command you" (John 15:14). In Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, God entered the world of human suffering and transformed it into an avenue of friendship with Himself. Following His command — to love, to lay down our lives for others — will always entail suffering. But this suffering only deepens our friendship with Him. His suffering is ours; ours is His. We have become friends of God.

This week, how might you share your suffering with the Risen Jesus? How might he be sharing his suffering with you, in the lives of those around you? Be attentive to that, and you'll find that you are indeed a friend of God, because you've suffered together a great deal.

Funeral Mass for Rev. Mr. Richard C. Yee † Friday, May 10, 2024 | 10:00 am

Please join us for Mass in memory of Deacon Richard Yee † (1938-2024).

Dn. Richard, a good and faithful servant of the Lord, passed into Eternal Rest at his home on April 24, 2024, surrounded by his loving wife Esther and his children, Steve (Anna), Kevin, and Lisa (Doug). Dn. Richard is also survived by his five grandchildren, Leslie, Kelsey, Nick, Jeremy, and Cameron, as well as his sister Pauline and numerous relatives and friends.

Dn. Richard was born in San Francisco on May 20, 1938, to parents Sam and Daisy Yee, and was the youngest of three children. He attended Sacred Heart High School in San Francisco. He joined the Army in 1957 and served for four years. During his time in the service, Dn. Richard felt a calling and was baptized into the Catholic faith on August 15, 1958.

On April 6, 1956, he met Esther Mae Hom. This began a lifetime of love for the couple who were married on July 8, 1961, at St. Agnes Church in San Francisco.

Dn. Richard worked at Lockheed in Sunnyvale for 33 years in a variety of departments. While there he became proficient in planning, engineering designs, and software writing. He worked with the company until his retirement in 1994.

In 1990, Dn. Richard recognized that the Lord was calling him again. After four years of discernment, he was ordained a Permanent Deacon in the Diocese of Oakland on February 25, 1995, by Bishop John Cummins. He served the Church at Holy Spirit Parish in Fremont for 29 years. He loved being in service to others and did so as a compassionate and attentive person. He helped to design logos and banners for various ministries in the tri-city area. He was also an Honorary Life Member of the Knights of Columbus.



Throughout Dn. Richard's service to the Church, Esther was always at his side for help and support. They served together for many years to the betterment of the church and the people of God.




