Have you ever moved away from a place where you lived for years near friends and family? When that happens, many feelings

flood our beings; sadness, fears, and deep grief at the fact of not seeing them or being in places you loved. I moved recently from Vermont back here to Fremont after 30 years. I experienced separation anxiety as I realized I would probably never see some of the people I loved in those places again. I wanted a way to take something with me and leave something behind for those I left.

Today's Gospel reminds us of Jesus' feelings as He realized His time here was coming to an end and wishing to provide some way to stay and help His friends cope with the loss of His physical presence.


As I was leaving Vermont, I spent quality time with all my family and friends before I left and gave each one a blessing that they could keep as a way of remembering me. As Jesus was leaving His close friends and mother, He wanted a way to stay with them and for them to celebrate His abiding presence always.

Jesus' ritual began at the Passover meal the night before His arrest. He took ordinary unleavened bread and wine and said the blessing. Jesus told those gathered that the wine and bread were now His Body and Blood and invited His followers to eat and drink. Jesus then instructed them that each time they performed this ritual in His memory, they would be united with Him.

Do we truly believe Jesus' words, that He is always with us in the Eucharist? We are so privileged to be able to receive Him when come to liturgy or when Holy Communion is administered outside of Mass (e.g., when we are homebound or ill). Our loving Brother desires to be with us and help us live God's life of love and compassion.

This is the gift we celebrate today – God's abiding presence in the Eucharist, Corpus Christi. Let us always be thankful for the gift of Jesus in our lives.



Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

The best way to understand the Eucharist is to recall God's long, careful teaching process beginning in the Old Testament. This week in Exodus 24, we learn the basic pattern. Moses reads the dictates of God's law to the people, who profess their allegiance to it. Then Moses takes representatives of Israel's twelve tribes and splashes the sacrificed blood of animals in two directions: on the altar and on the people. It's clear and serious business: clear, because the participants are entering a blood-bond with God Himself; serious, because the dead animals symbolize the life-and-death stakes at play.

Many centuries later, God uses the experience at Sinai to teach us something new. At the Last Supper, like a new Moses, Jesus proposes to "pour out" blood as a new covenant. It will land on the altar of the cross and the lips of his disciples. They have promised to be obedient to him who is God's law in flesh. This renews and elevates the breath-taking romance God wants with His people, unfolding from Sinai to this Supper. The Body and Blood of Christ is the sacrificial action whereby this covenant is strengthened.

How hopeful that, like us, the Israelites and the apostles repeatedly fail to live up to their promises and discover that the blood of the covenant continually renews and refreshes them. Today the blood of Christ faithfully flows, to unite and renew, moving us forward toward where our great teacher is taking us. This week, we should say a renewed "amen" to God who so carefully teaches us how to be one with Him in this new covenant.
