## FROM THE DESK OF DN. BERNARD...

Years ago, my cousin, who was a scuba divemaster and a dive tour entrepreneur, decided to expand his

business and rent an island south of the Philippines to cater to his growing foreign clientele. He asked me to join him in searching for a suitable island and design for him small cottages. So, together with a hired boatman and an island owner, we ventured to see the location late in the afternoon. It took some time to walk around the island to see if it was feasible enough for my cousin's planned business. Doing so took us a lot of time and it was getting dark.

It started to drizzle as we decided to head back to the main island which was approximately 30 to 40 minutes away. We were riding on a small 2x14-foot "bangka" (canoe type, double-outrigger boat). As the night became darker, lightning flashes started to build up from the clouds and made me nervous. I was nervous because we could be struck by lightning. I was also nervous because I was born and raised on the mountaintop, unlike my fellow boat companions who practically lived in water and who would have had better chances to survive if catastrophe struck.

With all these negative thoughts going on in my mind, fear was inside and all around me. I pretended to be calm but was praying so hard quietly, holding tight to both sides of the boat. While looking at the distant shore, seeing those dotted lights from the village becoming bigger and bigger brought relief and joy in my heart as we were closer to safety. Getting out of the dark and being in the light is what it's all about. As I look back at this experience, it was nothing compared with the struggle of the millions of Vietnamese people who risked their lives to escape tyranny, many of whom didn't make it. I've heard of their stories as they fled on boats with hope, faith and resilience to survive. Aren't these the same tools (hope, faith and resilience in the Lord) that we Christians should have in order to survive adversary and confront evil?

The Gospel teaches us a lesson on how to deal with unexpected storms that may come our way. It teaches us to always trust God. How can we not?

"Who then is this, who commands even the winds and the sea, and they obey him?" If elements of matter (wind/ water) obey the Lord's command, why can't we obey and follow Him?

The frightening storm didn't bother Jesus' deep sleep at all. Likewise, the storms of life don't bother Him as well. This is the reason why we should even more place our trust in Jesus. If we call upon Him, He can calm the storms we face in life.

Yes, fear is a natural human reaction. It is also okay to wake up the Lord at any time we are in fear. By doing so, we show our faith, trust, and dependence on Him.

For He frequently says, "I will never leave you nor forsake you". It is a promise of God's faithfulness and assurance of His daily presence and love for all His faithful people.

"Have no fear, Christ is near!"

This new movie tells the inspiring story of the beginnings of the Sister Servants of Mary, a religious order that was founded in Madrid, Spain in 1851 by Fr. Miguel Martinez and Sister Maria Soledad who guided it in its development and expansion until her death in 1887.

The new order was dedicated to serving the sick, especially in their own homes. It was a providential foundation because Spain at the time was devastated by epidemics, revolutions, the fierce massacre of religious, and by politics which were constantly opposed to the teachings of Christ and his Church. Assistance to the sick in their homes, never done before, was therefore all the more necessary.

Today there are 1,500 sisters in her order in 110 convents around the world, including several in the United States.

## Return to Distribution of the Precious Blood at Holy Communion

Beginning the weekend of August 3-4, 2024, we will once again offer Holy Communion under both species (bread and wine) here at Holy Spirit Parish.

Bishop Michael C. Barber, SJ, released a statement in May 2023 allowing the distribution of the Precious Blood, at the discretion of each pastor. The decision to reintroduce the offering of the chalice post-pandemic here at Holy Spirit has not been made lightly, and we are buoyed by the fact that, according to the CDC, we have "...more tools and resources than ever before to better protect ourselves and our communities."

Each of us should make our own decision when it comes to receiving one or both species. If you are immunocompromised, have respiratory symptoms, or may have been exposed to COVID or flu, it may be best to receive only the host.

We will begin by offering four chalices at each Vigil/Sunday Mass. Please be patient should we run out of the Precious Blood before you come to receive. We will adjust the amount of wine that is consecrated at each Mass as we gain experience with the number of people who seek to receive it.

Please note: One does not need to receive Holy Communion under both species to receive the full grace of the sacrament. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states: "Since Christ is sacramentally present under each of the species, communion under the species of bread alone makes it possible to receive all the fruit of Eucharistic grace." (CCC, No. 1390)
