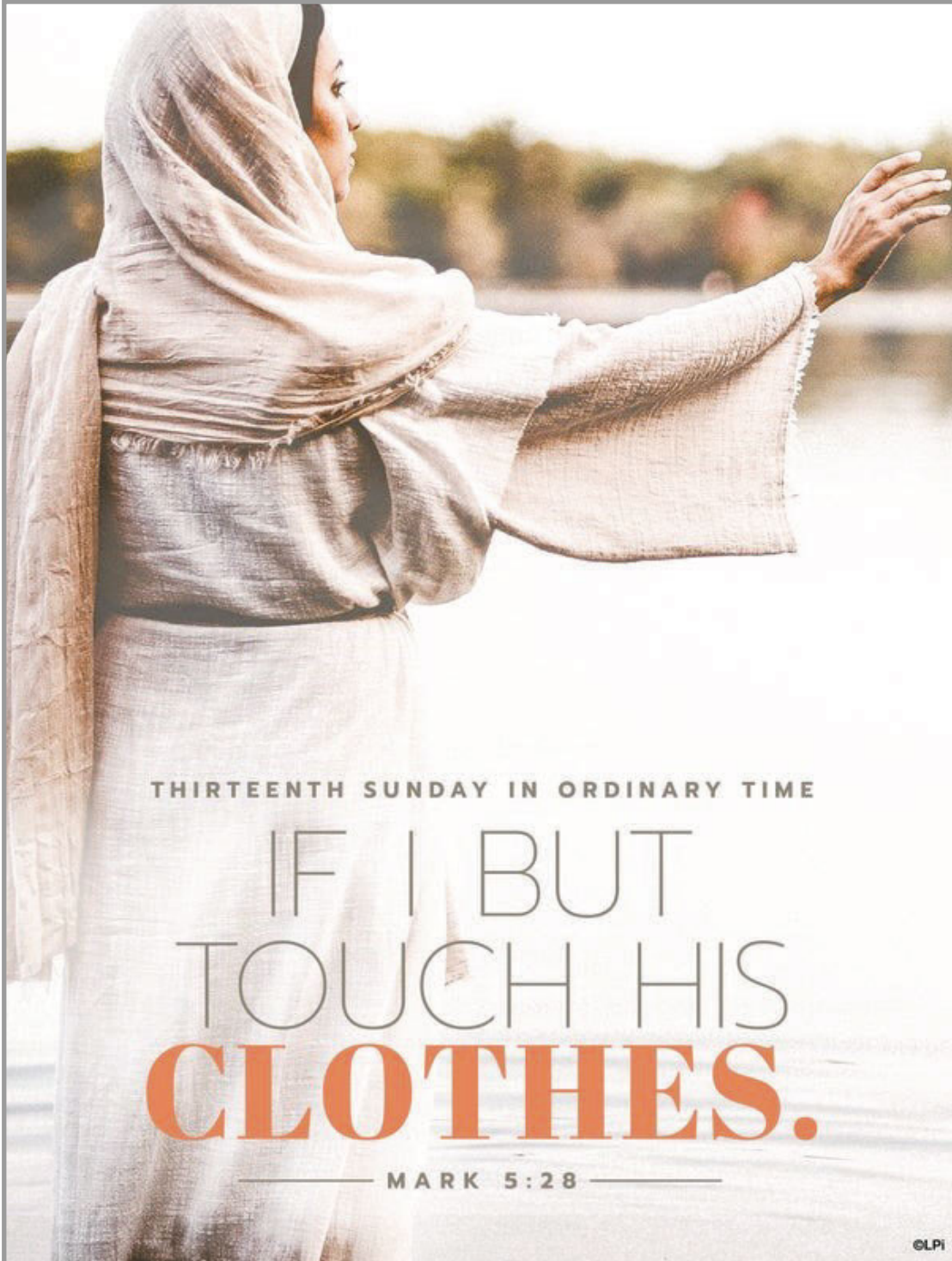

FROM THE DESK OF DN. STEVE...

Today's question is, *how strong is my faith in God?*

Today we hear of two healing miracles.

The first miracle is about a woman who was very ill and had suffered for over 12 years. She tried everything, including spending her last dime trying to get cured, but nothing worked; in fact, she got worse.

How many of us today have met someone or heard of someone with a terrible sickness? They will try anything to get better. When we get to this state of alarm and fear sets in, we are willing to do or spend everything. We do research and chase ideas; we search for answers, sometimes outside of our faith.

And when nothing seems to work, we remember our faith in Jesus. We desperately reach out to him, and Jesus responds. Your faith has saved you.

In the second miracle, we hear of a father who seemed to have tried everything as well. He loved his 12-year-old daughter, and she was at the point of death. Upon seeing Jesus, he fell at Jesus' feet, begged him to come and lay his hands on her, that she might get well and live.

When we have a family member or good friend dying, do we act the same way this father did? We believe and lean on our faith in Jesus to help comfort us in our time of need and we ask God for a miracle when all seems lost.

In both miracles, after trying to do everything their own way, and realizing they had no more left to try, they learned what true faith is.

Just by touching Jesus' cloak, the woman began to heal both physically and spiritually. Having complete faith in Jesus, she reached out to Him and embraced His presence.

The synagogue official's daughter died just before Jesus got to her. Yet Jesus took the child by the hand, and she came back to life.

We need to reach out to Jesus, to trust in our Lord. We need to seek God out and let Him into our lives unconditionally.

Pray to Jesus that He continues to journey with each of us throughout our life and hold our hands all the way back to our home, Heaven.

Let us ask ourselves again, *how strong is our faith?*

We need to bring our faith to others, especially those in need. We need to bring them God's love and compassion, and to bring them peace and hope.

You see, our faith gives us access to Jesus. Jesus proves He is the source of life and for all our needs.

Just as the girl was given something to eat after being raised from the dead, Jesus in the Eucharist nourishes everyone in our Church.

Your faith has saved you. Welcome home.

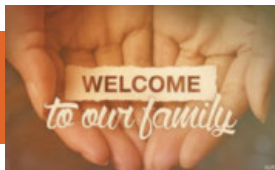

Return to Distribution of the Precious Blood at Holy Communion

Beginning the weekend of August 3-4, 2024, we will once again offer Holy Communion under both species (bread and wine) here at Holy Spirit Parish.

Bishop Michael C. Barber, SJ, released a statement in May 2023 allowing the distribution of the Precious Blood, at the discretion of each pastor. The decision to reintroduce the offering of the chalice post-pandemic here at Holy Spirit has not been made lightly, and we are buoyed by the fact that, according to the CDC, we have "...more tools and resources than ever before to better protect ourselves and our communities."

Each of us should make our own decision when it comes to receiving one or both species. If you are immunocompromised, have respiratory symptoms, or may have been exposed to COVID or flu, it may be best to receive only the host.

We will begin by offering four chalices at each Vigil/Sunday Mass. Please be patient should we run out of the Precious Blood before you come to receive. We will adjust the amount of wine that is consecrated at each Mass as we gain experience with the number of people who seek to receive it.

Please note: One does not need to receive Holy Communion under both species to receive the full grace of the sacrament. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states: "Since Christ is sacramentally present under each of the species, communion under the species of bread alone makes it possible to receive all the fruit of Eucharistic grace." (CCC, No. 1390)

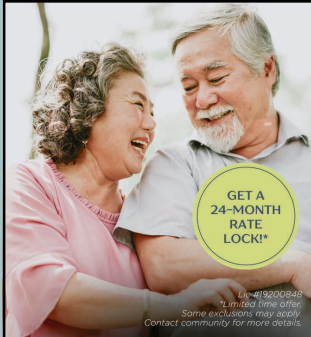

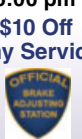
