

FROM THE DESK OF FR. BINH ...

We don't want to be unpleasant people, but we often act mean to others.

Complaining can be a bad habit for many people. That's why dealing with unhappy customers in customer service can be very challenging.

Although Elijah was God's prophet, he complained to God during his sufferings. He wanted nothing except death. The good thing about Elijah was his recognition. He humbly admitted that he was as bad as his ancestors in the desert when grieving in a difficult circumstance.

The people's grumblings were against God because they lacked meat and water in the desert.

God has been continuously grumbled to by the people he loves. Even people in Jesus' time complained about the living bread. Today's Gospel describes their reactions: "The Jews murmured about Jesus."

Even when people were being mean, God always showed His patience and kindness. He provided his people with bread and meat in the desert. He asked His angel to feed Elijah.

Jesus patiently explained to murmuring people the mystery, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." God promised to provide himself and eternal life to them, but they refused.

It can be said that our complaints are God's frequent headaches. God does not like our discontented reactions and commands us, "Stop murmuring among yourselves."

The murmuring people of Jesus' time didn't appreciate God. His words provoked "bitterness, fury, anger, shouting, and reviling." The mystery of the living bread was challenging for them to understand and accept. They lacked faith.

Today there are more people who lack faith than there are believers. We, the believers, need to pray for an increase of faith and belief in Jesus' real presence in the Eucharist. At the 10th National Eucharistic Congress, more than 50,000 attendees witnessed their faith in Jesus' Body and Blood. The number of believers needs to grow. It should include not only us, but everyone around us.

God gives us Himself in the Eucharist. When we have faith in God and receive Him in the Eucharist, we are happy people, not complaining people. The Eucharist is always thanksgiving!



Distribution of the Precious Blood at Holy Communion (Update)

We have begun offering Holy Communion under both species (bread and wine) during our daily Masses here at Holy Spirit.

We will start distributing the Precious Blood during our Vigil/Sunday Masses next weekend on August 17th and 18th.

Please be patient should we run out of the Precious Blood before you come to receive. We will adjust the amount of wine that is consecrated at each Mass as we gain experience with the number of people who seek to receive it.

Each of us should follow our own prudent judgment when it comes to receiving one or both species. If you are immunocompromised, have respiratory symptoms, or may have been exposed to COVID or flu, it may be best to receive only the host.

Please note: One does not need to receive Holy Communion under both species to receive the full grace of the sacrament. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states: "Since Christ is sacramentally present under each of the species, communion under the species of bread alone makes it possible to receive all the fruit of Eucharistic grace." (CCC, No. 1390)


