

### **NOURISH**



FROM THE DESK OF FR. EDDIE ...

Beloved parishioners,

In the gospel, Jesus asks His disciples, "Who do people say

that I am?" For us, the question is, "Have we ever paused to ponder on how much we know our Lord?" How would we answer the question? We might have had moments or experiences through which we have various and specific answers on who Jesus is in our lives. We might say that Jesus is our friend, brother, healer, teacher, or refuge, but what does it entail when we say any of these about Him?

Peter said to Him in reply, "You are the Christ." The word "Christ" is a Greek word that is equivalent to the Hebrew word "Messiah" which means the anointed or chosen one. In the time of Jesus, people had been longing for the promised messiah to bring freedom from the Romans. But Jesus the Christ is here to set us free from the bondage of our sins. Grace was given to Simon Peter to call lesus the Christ; vet. when the Lord revealed to Him that to be the Christ meant that He is to suffer, be rejected, killed and rise, Peter could not take this truth. For Peter, dying on the cross is a defeat, but we know now that lesus' death on the cross led to victory through which He redeemed us from our sinfulness.

The cross on which Jesus the Christ was crucified has become the source of God's unceasing love and mercy for all humanity. It is Jesus' death that bestows upon the wood of the Cross its power to save us. How do we respond to Jesus the Christ who took our infirmities and our brokenness due to sins by dying on the cross? It should lead us to faith and to manifest in our lives what we believe in Christ.

The apostle Saint James made it clear in the second reading, "What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone says he has faith but does not have works?" Our faith in Christ should prompt us to make a difference. What we do both in word and in deed will reveal who Jesus is truly for us. The faith that we have in Jesus the Christ makes us Christians but if we do really have that faith in Him, then we should be willing and committed to do the works that Christ demands from us.

Each week, we come to Mass and are nourished with the Word of God and receive the Holy Eucharist. In a sense, Jesus the Messiah continues to refresh and strengthen us. This is how we are configured more closely to Christ. We receive Him into ourselves, and we carry Him within us. Christ desires to transform us to become like Him. If we come to Mass every Sunday and remain the same, then what is it worth? In every Mass that we receive Christ, it is an invitation for us to profess our faith in Him and to remember to put into practice what we believe in Jesus the Messiah by announcing the gospel and glorifying the Lord by our lives.

I hold each one of you and your families in my prayers to Jesus our Lord Jesus Christ, that you may demonstrate your faith in Him by the daily acts of mercy that you will do every day in your life.
