

FROM THE DESK OF DN. CHUCK...

Humility

One of the intriguing questions we ask each week is, "How will the readings from the Old and New Testaments complement each other and how will they support the Gospel message?" Quite often, we need to search extensively to find the thread between them. Other times, they will seem to have no relation at all or maybe even contradict one another.

This week, there is a common theme between each of the readings. Summed up in the Gospel, it is a message of humility. Jesus redefines what if means to be great. It is not about power, position or prestige. It is about humility, sacrifice and service.

In the reading from Wisdom, we are told that those who are wicked will test our faith. In today's world, those who live with righteousness, humility and compassion may be seen as weak. They can be targeted for their commitment to God's truth, just as Jesus was mocked and scorned by onlookers who challenged Him to "come down from the cross."

In James, we hear that envy and selfish ambition will lead to chaos and to external conflicts. Envy is a desire for what others have, and selfish ambition is the drive to elevate ourselves above others. He is not just pointing at society; he is pointing at us. The battle between evil forces and the forces that lead us to humility and compassion lie within each of us.

Wisdom and James then lead us to the Gospel message. Who better to be an example of righteousness than a child? A child wants to learn and soak up all that they are taught, finds fascination in all new things they experience, and continues to explore and expand their boundaries. As a parent of a child, we protect them and lead them by example. We allow them to explore new things all while ensuring their safety. We are ready and willing to admonish them when they go beyond the boundaries that have been set. But we never stop loving them and continue to encourage their growth and development.

That child is not some nameless or faceless young person. That child is us. Each one of us is a child of our Father in Heaven. He teaches and protects us. He encourages us to explore and develop our own persona. When we do go beyond our boundaries, He is there to accept us back and to forgive our transgressions.

God wants to lead us to greatness. As previously stated, greatness is not about power, position or prestige. It is about humility, sacrifice, and service. Jesus shows us the ultimate example of greatness by laying down His life for others, and He calls us to follow in His footsteps.

As we go out into the world, may we embrace the path of humility, seeking not our own greatness, but the greatness that comes from serving others. When we welcome the lowly, serve the marginalized, and humble ourselves, we are welcoming Christ Himself and walking in the true greatness of God's kingdom.

Special Collection: Disaster Relief for the Diocese of Hai Phong, Vietnam

September 21-22, 2024

With the authorization of The Most Reverend Michael C. Barber, SJ, we are taking up a Special Collection this weekend for disaster relief.

In his letter to the pastors and priests in the Oakland Diocese, Bishop Barber noted the special relationship with the Diocese of Hai Phong, which he and Rev. George Mockel visited over 10 years ago.

"Typhoon Yagi has brought devastating impacts to the North of Vietnam, particularly in the provinces of Quang

Ninh, Hai Phong, and Lao Cai. The storm has caused widespread flooding and landslides..." resulting in hundreds of deaths, destruction of homes and over 184,000 hectares of crops, and damage to the infrastructure, including roads and bridges. "Additionally, the storm has disrupted transportation networks, causing power outages and communication disruptions, with over 438,000 people affected...The people of North Vietnam are in dire need of support and aid to recover from the devastating effects of Typhoon Yagi."






