

## FROM THE DESK OF DN STEVE...

Today is the last day of the Christmas season. Today we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord.

How many of us remember the day and year we were baptized? We remember our birthday, why not our baptism? We enter this world at birth, and we are baptized into God's heavenly family. These are two days we should celebrate.

When Jesus approached John, who was baptizing with water, Jesus wanted John to be baptize Him. John had been preparing the way of the Lord and knew who Jesus was and who Jesus was to become.

Jesus wanted John to baptize Him, just like everyone else. While John felt unworthy to baptize our Lord, it was John who introduced Jesus to the world. And we see the first sign of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit – the Trinity.

John you can say is the bridge from the Old Testament to the New Testament.

Jesus is God and has no sins, so why would our Lord want to be baptized? By being baptized by John, Jesus identified Himself with all humanity in order to take away the sins of each of us in this crazy world.

By accepting John's baptism, Jesus was saying yes to God, thus following the path God laid out. Which

would include loving us unconditionally, guiding us, healing us, teaching us, forgiving us, and ultimately His Passion – His suffering and death – and Resurrection.

Through our own baptism, each of us has our own unique path in life. This path, as laid out by God, will be challenging, with many good times and tough times. Yet it is a path that will ultimately end in Heaven, with the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

Jesus tore down the walls of sin, said yes to God through His baptism, and reconnected us to the Father, through our personal Baptism.

Like John, let us prepare the way of the Lord and help others find their faith and heavenly family.
