

FROM THE DESK OF ROSALYN...

Mary's words are recorded four times in the bible. At the Annunciation, the Magnificat at the Visitation, when the boy Jesus was found in the Temple

after three days, and at the Wedding in Cana. Each incident teaches us something about Mary.

At the Annunciation, Mary was a shining example of humble acceptance of God's will in our lives. Mary placed more importance on obedience to God's will over the severe repercussions of being found with child before marriage in ancient Jewish culture. She surrendered completely to God's plan even when it was difficult to understand. Her unquestioning faith and trust in God's goodness allowed her to believe that God would respond to the immediate need of the newly married couple and their guests in our Gospel today.

Mary's Magnificat proclaimed God's greatness, God's power, and God's mercy. Mary recognized her place as a humble handmaid before God and willingly offered herself as God's instrument to fulfill His purpose. She expressed solidarity with those in need, the poor, and marginalized. Despite her own pregnancy, she rushed to help Elizabeth. As someone who cared about the wellbeing of others, it is easy to understand her concern for the family running out of wine.

Having lost the twelve-year-old Jesus in the temple, Mary's experience can teach us to trust

in God's plan, even when we are experiencing trials, and to pray that God may be glorified in our need. God may be teaching us through these difficulties. When the couple was faced with impending embarrassment because of the wine running out, God indeed was glorified in their need.

At the wedding in Cana, Mary's belief in God teaches us to fully trust in Jesus and to follow in His way even when we do not fully understand what God is asking of us. She demonstrated her unwavering faith when she confidently approached Jesus with a problem, believing he would solve it. Mary was actively involved, rather than being a helpless observer. She continues in that role from heaven now as an advocate for us by bringing our needs to Jesus

Mary is a model for how to respond to God's call in our lives. Mary invites us to be an instrument of God's grace to those around us, especially those in need. To always trust in God's providence to provide for our needs. When we place our complete trust in God, God always exceeds our expectations. Jesus provided drink finer than that which the hosts originally intend.

"Do whatever he tells you" signifies complete faith and confidence in Jesus. The dictionary defines whatever as something with no restrictions, no matter what happens. Mary invites us to go all in when it comes to listening to her Son. So, what does Jesus ask of us? To summarize in four words, 'Love God, love neighbor.' (Mark 12: 28-34)


