FROM THE DESK OF DN BERNARD...

Beyond Expectations

Expectation is a confident belief or strong hope that a particular thing

will happen, but in reality, may not even happen. There are things beyond our control which cannot be changed or influenced, for this is human nature. But recognizing what is beyond our control allows us to focus our energy and resources on areas we can influence and change for the better.

Often, we set the bar too high, not only for ourselves but for those around us, too. We expect others to meet the standards we set forth.

Expectation is a toss of the coin. On one hand, it may inspire us and guide our behavior toward goals and accomplishments. On the other hand, it can lead us to frustration or disappointment when reality doesn't align with what we tried to predict. If we seek God's intervention, then our expectation must be in line with the will of God. In the case of Simon (Peter), when Jesus told him to go out to the deeper water and let down the nets, he was a bit doubtful and responds: "Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing". His reasoning is understandable, for he was an experienced fisherman. Normally, the way to catch fish in the Sea of Galilee was at night in the shallow part near the shore and not in the deep part during the day.

But because of Simon's affection and admiration for Jesus, just like the multitude of people who followed Jesus to listen to Him, he placed his trust in Jesus. Simon acted in faith, which contradicted his professional work experience. He was obedient to the word of the Lord and acted on the invitation. He ignored his own ego and avoided doing only what he could understand. He subjected himself to the will of the Lord.

As an employee, I always do and give my best. But there have been times when I have finished a project and presented it to my boss, he would comment, "Is this all?" or "Do you do you have other options?" In those instances, I have felt like all my hard work had gone to waste and had no desire to do things over again. But in

fairness, most of the time, the comments of others can bring out the very best results.

At times we limit ourselves instead of "going deeper." Jesus instructs, "Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch." Just like our faith, the Lord wants us not to remain on the shallow surface but to go deeper into our spiritual being to discover something even greater and to experience God's love and grace. The lessons of life teach us the basics to make ourselves comfortable, and when confident, venture to the unknown to make us even better.

Despite Simon's reluctance, he opened himself and followed the instruction of Jesus and said, "...but at your command I will lower the nets."

"When they had done this, they caught a great number of fish, and their nets were tearing." Here Simon Peter shows us his character and his act of faith. A deed that surpasses the boundaries of human capability.

How often do we drop our pride and put our hope in the Lord?

Sometimes, by letting go of our expectations, we also ease our burden. When we follow Jesus, amazing things happen. With authentic faith in Him, the impossible becomes possible.

When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at the knees of Jesus and said, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." Because of Jesus' astounding miracle, Simon became aware of his own sinfulness and his desperate need of a Savior. I guess this is a statement we, too, may say when we are desperate for help and God suddenly does marvelous things to answer our prayers, even though we don't deserve it.

Heavenly Father, grant us the courage to cast our fears aside and to trust in Your divine guidance. Just as Simon Peter cast his nets into the deep waters at Your command, help us to step out in faith, knowing that You are with us. Fill our hearts with the strength to face the unknown and the wisdom to follow Your will. May we become fishers of men, spreading Your love and light to all we encounter. In Jesus' name, we pray. Amen.
